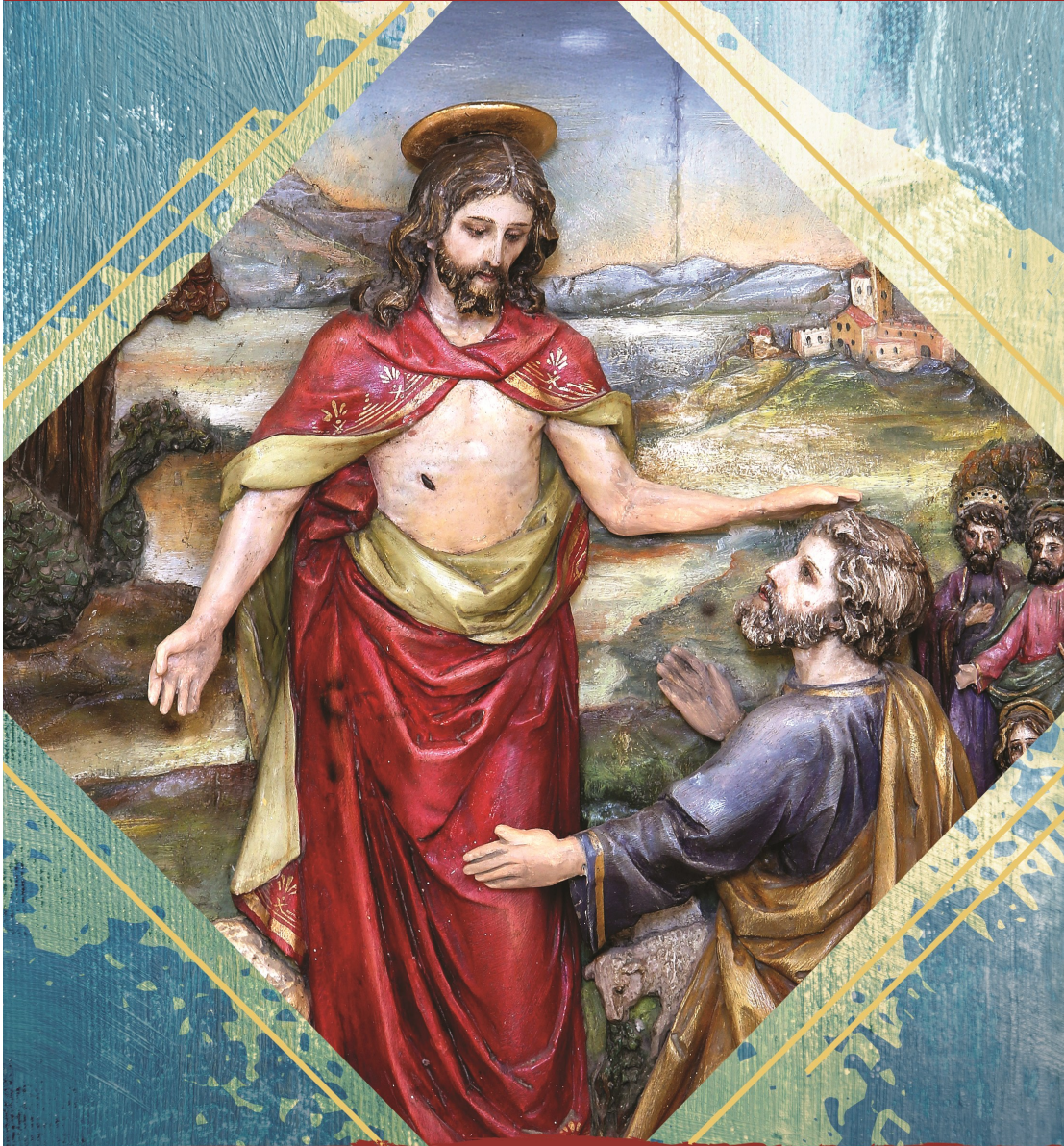

Introduction to Liturgy of the Word Easter Sunday

- Acts 5:27–32, 40b–41 The apostles openly give witness to the power of Jesus' name.
- Psalm 30 "I will praise you, Lord, for you have rescued me."
- Revelation 5:11–14 John declares the glory of Jesus, the Lamb of God.
- John 21:1–19 or The risen Christ welcomes his own at the seashore. 21:1–14

In the first reading, Saint Peter courageously faces down the Sanhedrin when they try to forbid the disciples from preaching and teaching in Jesus' name. The Gospel reveals that Jesus himself gave Peter that courage by leading him to profess his love for him three times, as he had lacked that courage when denying Jesus three times. May we realize that Jesus constantly invites us to reconciliation as well, instilling in us the courage to spread the Good News.

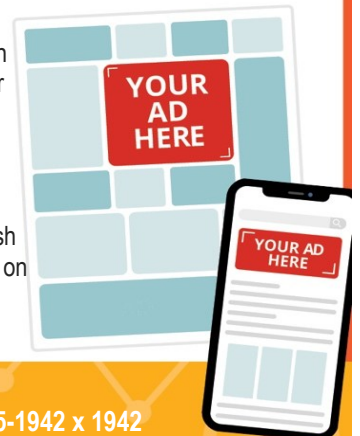

April is Child Abuse Awareness Month

Did you know...What is happening in the diocese to protect children?

- *Training is provided for all adults and youth to identify warning signs and develop strategies for maintaining a safe environment for all.*
- *A designated Victim Assistance Coordinator is available to receive reports and accompany victims through their journey.*
- *A volunteer independent Review Board assists the bishop in the review of cases and makes recommendations for moving forward.*
- *A Safe Environment Coordinator assists parish and school personnel with training and background screenings for anyone who may have access to children.*
- *An audit is conducted by an independent firm to evaluate implementation of the Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People. Findings are incorporated with those of other dioceses and made available in an Annual Report.*

The Office of Youth and Young Adult Ministry will be offering a Young Adult Retreat Day for all young adults (18-39) throughout the diocese on Saturday, July 26, 2025, at St. Thomas More Parish in Paducah, KY. The theme of the retreat is Hope and it will feature Fr. Chris Kight and Karina Romero as the presenters. The cost of the retreat is \$25 per participant which will include a light breakfast and lunch. The retreat is from 9AM-6PM and will conclude at the 5PM Mass at St. Thomas More. There will be an optional dinner outing after the retreat that is not included in the registration fee.

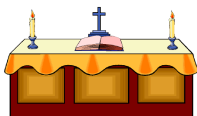

Order Of Christian Initiation Of Adults

Spiritual Life Committee

People may be familiar with leprosy from Biblical times, but not so much in the 1800s. However, St. Damien de Veuster of Moloka'I (January 3, 1840 – April 15, 1889) would eventually shed a light on the effects of this devastating disease and allow people to see those afflicted with it with more compassion and love.

Born Joseph de Veuster in Tremelo, Belgium, he quit school at 13 so he could work on the family farm. Feeling called for more, however, he entered the Congregation of the Sacred Hearts of Jesus and Mary six years later, where he took the name of a fourth-century physician and martyr. His brother, a priest from the same congregation, fell ill and was unable to go to his assigned location. Damien quickly volunteered in his place and found himself on the Hawaiian Islands in 1864. Two months after arriving, he was ordained a priest of Honolulu and assigned to the Island of Hawaii.

In 1873, he visited the Hawaiian government's leper colony on the island of Moloka'I, where he petitioned to stay permanently to care for their physical, medical, and spiritual needs. After years of working to improve their location and those who lived there, he contracted Hansen's disease and died of its complications. He found strength to endure isolation and disease in Eucharistic adoration and the celebration of the Mass. St. Damien was canonized by Pope Benedict XVI on October 11, 2009. St. Damien de Veuster of Moloka'I, pray for us!
