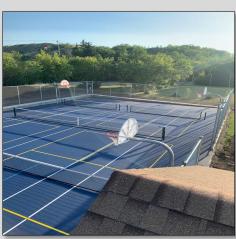

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DEVELOPMENT & BUILDING PERMITS

If you are considering development of your property and unsure if you require a permit, please contact the office to check before commencing any project. Accessory buildings, detached garages, carports, boathouses, attached garages, additions, basement development, building moved in, deck, dwelling, foundation replacement, modular home, renovation, retaining wall (over 3'), guest house, prefabbed sunroom all require a permit. For most projects you will be required to supply a copy of your lot survey or real property report to ensure you are developing on your own property, and to ensure proper

set backs are in place or you have the space available to develop. You can find permit applications on our website or contact the office, one can be emailed or mailed to you. Depending on your development and the topography of the land you may be asked to supply a topographical survey and a geotechnical report by an engineer. Applications are to be submitted one week prior to Council meetings.

YARD DEBRIS AND WASTE COLLECTION

Yard debris will be collected every Monday for the months of May September and October, every other Monday for June, July and August to assist you with your yard clean up. Please have your debris bagged and out by 7am sharp to ensure pick up.

Waste collection is **every Tuesday at 7am sharp** to ensure pick up. Please have waste bagged and in a secure bin with secure lid to keep wildlife rodents or pets out.

COUNCIL MEETINGS

Council meets regularly the 3rd Tuesday of the month at 2pm. Any submissions need to be in one week prior to be on the agenda. If you would like to be a delegate at the meeting please contact the office one week prior to regular meeting. The Free Haul-R Daze program has come to an end

The last day will be:

Sunday, May 30, 2021

Doors open 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.

This program is <u>exclusively</u> for the residents of our <u>Member</u> <u>Municipalities</u>

Free tipping fee regulations:

- One free load per household
- Load size:
 - o Cars, vans, pick-up trucks or utility trailers up to 4' x 8' or 2.5 cu yards
- Will be for HOUSEHOLD residential refuse only, NOT commercial refuse
- . Used oil, antifreeze, filters and containers will be free as usual

Not included:

- · Paint (even empty cans), small appliances and electronics need to go to SARCAN
- Tires, fluorescent light bulbs and railroad ties will be charged the regular load charge fees
- · Appliances with Freon will be charged \$10 for Freon removal.

All North Valley Waste regulations will apply:

*Loads must be secure to prevent littering during the trip to the landfill
*Loads must be sorted into: Metal, clean wood, compost, household garbage, recycling, etc.

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Beach Guidelines Until Further Notice (the following is applicable to B-Say-Tah Beach)

- All operators in Saskatchewan must be in compliance with these guidelines. The information below provides guidelines for beaches in Saskatchewan.
- People exhibiting signs of illness should not enter beach areas. If you think you may be sick, use the Government of Saskatchewan's self-assessment tool for COVID-19 and follow the subsequent directions.
- Individuals from different groups must maintain a physical distance of two meters outdoors, indoors, on the beach and in the water.
- Towels and beach gear should be set up with four meters between groups to allow physical distancing to be maintained for those entering or exiting the area.
- There must be no more individuals per group than allowed under the private and public gathering restrictions.
- Towels, beach toys, food and other items should not be shared between members of different groups.
- If the beach area is full, please use adjacent grass areas, where available, to ensure group and individual physical distancing is maintained.
- Bring your own picnic table covers, cleaning supplies, hand hygiene supplies and other personal items.
- It's recommended that users clean and disinfect surfaces before and after using (e.g. picnic tables), and practice frequent hand hygiene, especially before and after consuming food.
- Frequently wash your hands with soap and water or use hand sanitizer approved by Health Canada (DIN or NPN number) if you come into contact with public or common touch surfaces (e.g. washroom facilities, benches, tables, playground equipment).
- Where possible, access to beaches should be controlled and occupancy limited (e.g. limit parking, set maximum occupancy, signage).
- Display posters in common spaces reminding beach users of physical distancing and beach rules (e.g. parking lot, beaches, picnic areas).
- Advise users that if an area is busy, picnic shelter or beach, come back when it's not busy or use another area.
- Washroom facilities must be open with increased cleaning and disinfecting. Operators must ensure washrooms are stocked with soap and water or hand sanitizer approved by Health Canada (DIN or NPN number).
- Events are not permitted on beaches at this time.



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Multi Use Court Guidelines (Applicable to B-Say-Tah Multi –Use Court)

Preparing to play (tennis, pickle ball, basketball)

- Do not play if you or your playing partner (s) are feeling unwell or exhibiting any symptoms, such as fever, cough or difficulty breathing.
- Wash your hands with soap and water, and bring hand sanitizer approved by Health Canada (DIN or NPN) with you.
- Clean your equipment.
- Consider wearing a mask while you play if you can't maintain two meters of physical distance.
- Avoid commonly touched surfaces; however, when you must, wash your hands and disinfect any surfaces you have been in contact with, including door handles, gates and benches.
- Social distancing while waiting to play.

Play

- Singles play is recommended. Doubles play is permitted as long as participants are from the same household.
- To prevent queuing or gathering, limit your play to 30minutes or 1 set if people are waiting to use court.
- Recommended No sharing of equipment (e.g. racquets, basketballs).
- Respect physical distancing of two meters with other players at all times on and off the playing surface.
- For racquet sports, each player should use their own can of balls, with distinct markings or numbers for each player. As much as possible, use your racquet or foot to pass a ball to another player.
- For basketball, small group of 8, from same "bubble" masks recommended, if not from same "bubble", games are not permitted. If on court shooting hoops with "non-bubble" members, masks recommended. Physical distancing must be maintained.

After Play

- Wash your hands with soap and water. If soap and water are not available, use hand sanitizer approved by Health Canada (DIN or NPN).
- Leave the playing area immediately after you complete play.
