expands the space both inside and around us. That spaciousness allows for many more possibilities.

The Fishin' Hole

The craziness up north on the Erie Tributaries is officially in full swing with the last week or so producing lots of rain and cooler temperatures in the area. The steelhead are in the streams for sure. Conditions change rapidly and now there is a new tool to help you decide whether or not to make the drive. There are live cameras available to show you the lake and Walnut Creek and even the parking lot there, so you can make a well informed decision. All you need to do is go to fishusa.com/webcams to access the live look. This is an awesome tool. If you are heading up, stay dry and warm and remember the key to steelhead will always be the drift of your bait. The more natural your bait looks in the water column, the more bites you will get.

Closer to home the cooler temperatures and rain are also very welcome in our local streams and rivers. A very slow walleye bite for most of September and a good chunk of October has changed dramatically with the temperatures. I had a day late in the month on the Ohio River that produced walleye throughout the day even after the sun was well up in the sky. The walleye and Smallmouth are

now officially preparing for a long winter. That means getting as many calories as they can before food sources become more scarce.

Search for baitfish activity and you will be where the fish are. Live shiners or fathead minnows are an awesome bait any time of the year, but especially now when they represent a highly nutritious meal for hungry game fish. Hook a shiner up through the bottom lip and slowly jig it or just bounce it off the bottom with a small split shot. Keep everything moving toward you very slowly and the walleye will do the rest of the work. The fish will be near points and drop-offs. Walleye and bass will use these areas to round up and trap baitfish, plus the drop to deeper water allows them to feel safe and secure while hunting.

If you like to chase the trout close to home, the news is excellent. The Pennsylvania Fish and Boat Commission says they will be stocking nearly 90,000 adult trout this fall. In fact, Pine Creek, Racoon Lake, Canonsburg Lake and Dutch Fork Lake have all just recently received a fresh stocking. Trout are voracious in the cold water and you will have great luck with mealworms, red worms, and, salmon eggs. The key to enjoying any fall fishing is your personal comfort and the comfort of anyone you bring along. Remember you can always take off a jacket or hat if you get too warm, but you can't put them on if you forgot to bring them along. That is a lesson I have learned forty-seven times!

Soon there will be talk of ice fishing and this month the PA Fish and Boat Commission (PFBC) is hosting an online event that will give you

all the skills and information you need to do so safely.

Join PFBC staff and Fishing Skills Instructor, Don Kelly, owner of Tackle Shack in Wellsboro, to learn the basics of ice fishing!

Those who attend this virtual program will get an invitation to attend an in-person ice fishing program in January/February 2026, weather pending!

- * Ice Safety
- * Where to find fish in the winter - intro to habitat maps
