- Mulch Add a layer of mulch to keep weeds down and help the ground retain its moisture in the heat.
- Clean or replace outdoor mats
- Wash windows
- Analyze your deck Look for signs of rotting and hammer in any nails that are poking up. Not sure whether to re-seal it? Sprinkle water on the boards. If the water beads up, you're in good shape; but if it soaks in right away, it's time to re-seal it.
- · Clean outdoor cooker
- Inspect air conditioners

TIPS FOR KEEPING YOUR PROPERTY SAFE

While our neighborhood is a wonderful place to live, we all have to be diligent in protect our property. Here are some helpful tips:

- * Anytime you are not home, make sure you lock the doors to your home. Most burglaries happen during broad daylight when everyone is at work.
- * Leave a TV on when you're not home, so that you give the appearance of someone being home.
- * Make sure you lock your car doors and do not leave valuables in your vehicle. If you do leave valuables in your car, place them in your trunk where they are out of sight. Glove boxes and center consoles are car prowlers number one spots to check. If you do become a victim of a car prowl, check the surrounding bushes on your block. Car prowlers tend to stash the items they take in bushes and come back for them later.
- * Turn your outdoor lights on at night and leave them on until the morning. This extra light is a deterrent to prowlers.
- * Report all crimes to the Albany Police Department. This will assist them in assigning patrols and knowing what to look for.

ARCHITECTURAL CHANGES

Please remember that making visible changes to your home or property might require Board approval. This includes exterior paint, major structural changes to the interior, etc. If you're planning any projects, please take a moment to review the Architectural Change requirements detailed in the CC&Rs. This can be found under Article C. An Architectural Change Request Form is available on the HOA's website, or can be requested by contacting a member of the Board. We do our best to respond promptly.
