2018 MEMBERSHIP FORM

The Good Horseman[®] **Foundation** is a non-profit, tax-exempt, 501 (c) (3) organization of experienced members of the dressage community, including equine professionals, dressage instructors, trainers, competitors, judges, "L" Graduates and members of dressage competition management. The Foundation is a Group Member Organization (GMO) of The United States Dressage Federation and participates in USDF programs such as the Instructor Certification and the "L" Judges Education Programs. Your membership makes you a GROUP MEMBER of USDF. All members are eligible to compete for USDF rider awards, adult camps and will receive a subscription to the USDF national newsletter. Those wishing to qualify for the USDF Regional Championships must apply directly to USDF to become a PARTICIPATING MEMBER to be eligible.

The amount of your GHF annual dues is \$30 single membership (\$20 goes to USDF per person and \$10 remains in the Foundation as your dues); \$45 family membership for two listed persons (include \$10 per each additional family member).

The objective of the Foundation is for the preservation and protection of the sport and art of dressage and to encourage its development to the highest levels. The Foundation's work will be limited to the organization of dressage competitions and the creation of educational opportunities such as seminars, clinics, scholarships and forums. An annual meeting is held every January, but no monthly meetings since most of our work is done by phone and e-mail.

Membership dues and renewals will be due Nov. 1st for the next year. Those joining for the first time after Sept. 1 will members for the next year.

There will be no newsletter as such but you will be on a GHF e-mail list and will receive prize lists for our upcoming shows by email. Information about upcoming activities can be found on our website.

Riders competing in GHF Schooling Shows will be automatically enrolled as GHF members for that year if they complete this membership form and attach it to their entry form. (revised 1/2017)

GENERAL INFORMATION FOR EVERYONE

SHOW MANAGEMENT: This show is organized by The Good Horseman Foundation. GHF membership is not required. <u>Please make checks payable to The Good Horseman Foundation.</u>

NO SUBSTITUTIONS: Horses and/or riders may not be substituted after the closing date. However, a new horse may be <u>post-entered</u> in the show. A new entry form must be filled out, the \$10 post-entry fee per class must be paid and a new bridle number issued. The original show fees will be transferred.

DIRECTIONS: The Georgia International Horse Park (GIHP) is located on Centennial Olympic Parkway (on right) off of GA Hwy.138 four miles north of Exit 82 off of I-20. Follow signs to main entrance on right. Trailers should take the third park entrance. Show office phone: (770) 602-2510. Park office phone: (770) 860-4195.

STABLING is not mandatory. Ship-ins are allowed and trailers may be parked in a designated area near the competition arenas. If you wish to be stabled with a group, please select ONE PERSON'S NAME (not farm names) for everyone in the group to use. For large groups, please draw a map for stall placements. These are the same facilities that were used in the 1996 Olympic Games. Permanent stalls with doors, water and electricity is provided. All stalls come with two bags of shavings. Additional shavings may be obtained by adding \$8 per bag to your entry form in the space provided, or they may be purchased at the park from Queen Wood Products (ask for Avery Harper) at 770-860-9111. Farm animals are not allowed.

SHOW OFFICE: The show secretary's office will be in a stall #515 in front of Barn 5 and will be open to competitors on Saturday from 2 to 6 p.m., and Sunday at 7 a.m. till the end of show.

AWARDS: Six ribbons will be given each day in each class, Introductory through Fourth Level, including CT dressage, CT overall and Freestyle. High-score and Reserve ribbons will be awarded in each division: Dressage, Eventing Dressage and Western Dressage.

CLASS LIMIT: Riders may enter a horse in no more than three classes/tests per day in accordance with USEF guidelines..

HOSPITALITY: A concessions stand will be open Saturday and Sunday, with an abbreviated schedule if the park is not busy then, in which case the concessions stand will open by 9 a.m. and will close shortly after lunch each day.

CAMPER/RV HOOK-UPS: Camper and RV hook-ups are available at \$35 per night. Restroom building with hot/cold showers is available. Add your order to your entry form. <u>You will receive a large pink camper sign in your packet. Please display this in a prominent place on your camper for ID.</u>

ACCOMMODATIONS: Hawthorn Suites Hotel at 770-761-9155 (across from the park) offers suites complete with mini-kitchen and separate bedroom. Other hotels: Holiday Inn 770-483-3220 (pets welcome here); Days Inn 770-922-3314; Hampton Inn 770-483-8838; Ramada 770-760-0777.

DEFINITIONS AND ELIGIBILITY—Open: Anyone may ride in the Open division, including amateurs, professionals and Jr./Young Riders. Individuals are eligible to enter as **Juniors/Young Riders** until the calendar year in which they reach age 21. Competitors may compete as **Adults** from the beginning of the calendar year in which they reach age 22. (USEF DR 119.) Professionals must ride only in Open classes. **Green Horses** are those which have not reached their 7th birthday during the competition year. Horses under 36 months of age (to the day) may not be ridden in any dressage under -saddle class. Proof of horse's date of foaling must accompany entries of all three-year-old horses.

RIDE TIMES: The show will post confirmation of entries, ride times and assigned stall numbers on The Good Horseman Foundation's website: **www.goodhorseman.org**. Confirmations and ride times also will be e-mailed.

ARENAS: The standard 20X60 and 20X40-meters arenas will be used as specified. The show will be held in the park's

Arenas 8 and 9. All have sand-mix footing. Lungeing is permitted **only** in the special lungeing ring designated by a posted sign for that purpose at the horse park except in bad weather when they may be flooded. In that case, see show secretary. No one on foot is allowed in the warm-up areas—coaching must be done from the side. Cones or other markers/obstacles are not allowed in the warm-up areas.

ENTRIES may be paid by check or credit card with a \$10 EFT (electronic funds transfer) fee for electronic payment. However, they will not be accepted unless accompanied by signed entry forms.

ADDRESS: Make checks payable to <u>The Good Horseman Foundation</u>, and mail all entries to 4567 Rockbridge Road #297, Pine Lake, GA 30072-0297. Waive signature on overnight or Fed-Ex packets or you may be late.

RETURNED CHECKS: A \$35 fee will be levied against any competitor whose check is returned.

REFUNDS will be given in full prior to the closing date for any reason. After the closing date, there will be no refunds. However, in the case of illness or injury to horse or rider, a credit may be issued toward a future GHF show with a veterinarian's or physician's certificate (the certifying vet or doctor may not be owner, rider or trainer) received by management within 10 days of the show. To receive credit, rider or representative must notify the show secretary in person before show starts so the riding times may be filled: e-mails and voice-mail messages do not count.

DOGS MUST BE LEASHED ON LINE NO LONGER THAN 6'. CHILDREN ON BICYCLES ARE NOT ALLOWED. UNLICENSED DRIVERS ARE NOT ALLOWED TO OPERATE GOLF CARTS ON PARK PROPERTY.

THE COMPETITION committee reserves the right to limit entries, to add or divide classes, to add or substitute judges or make whatever changes are required by circumstances to the competition specifications herein. Entries will be accepted on a first-come basis before the closing date.

POST ENTRIES for horses already entered in the show may be accepted if space is available upon payment of regular class fees plus an additional post-entry fee of \$10 per class.

LATE FEE: Entries accepted after the closing date will be charged a \$20 late fee.

COGGINS AND HEALTH CERTIFICATES: A copy of a current negative Coggins certificate dated within 12 months must accompany the entry form. Georgia law requires the original certificate to accompany the horse. The Georgia International Horse Park requires owners of out-of-state horses to supply proof of horse's current health certificate for interstate travel.

DRESSAGE SCHOOLING SHOW INFORMATION

GHF MEMBERSHIP: While GHF membership is not required at this show, anyone entering a GHF schooling show will automatically be enrolled as a USDF GMO member for the year but they must fill out a membership form (Page 2) and send it in with their entry. This GMO membership allows them to compete at USEF/USDF-recognized shows, but they must be USDF Participating Members to be eligible to qualify and compete at the USDF Regional Championships.

SPECIAL DRESSAGE REQUIREMENTS: Certified safety helmets, boots with heels and competition numbers are required at all times while mounted during the show for dressage and eventing dressage riders. While show coats and braiding are not required, they are recommended for those who want to make a good impression. No coaching from sidelines during any dressage test under penalty of possible elimination. All dressage tests must be ridden with simple snaffle bits. Kimberwick and Pelham bits are not permitted. Draw reins and standing martingales not permitted to be used on a horse anywhere on the grounds. Whips longer than 47.2" in length, including lash, are not allowed in dressage tests OR in warm-ups. Tests may be called. All riders are responsible for knowing the U.S. Equestrian Federation dressage rules which can be found on the USEF website: www.usef.org.

GDCTA POINTS: The show is recognized by the Georgia Dressage and Combined Training Association, Inc. Show dressage results are eligible to be counted toward GDCTA year-end awards. Show manager is Ann Genovese. Scores through 2nd Level will be eligible for GDCTA Year-End Awards.

LISA SEGER MEDAL: The Lisa Seger Insurance Adult Amateur Medal Program is designed to specifically recognize and encourage Adult Amateurs riding at Training Level. The eligible rider achieving the highest score of 60 percent or better in the Training Level Test 3 class designated as the Adult Amateur Medal class at in this show will receive a Lisa Seger Insurance Medal and neck ribbon. The Lisa Seger Insurance Medal Final Champion and Reserve Champion will be determined at the GDCTA Schooling Finals in August at Wills Park. The champion will receive a Trophy, Saddle Pad and Ribbon and the reserve champion will receive a Trophy and Ribbon. To be eligible, the rider must have a current GDCTA membership and be a member in good standing of GDCTA when the scores are earned. The rider must be an Adult Amateur in accordance with Article GR1306 of the USEF Rules when the scores are earned, and must present their USEF AA card to management. The horse and owner must meet minimum competition eligibility requirements at the time scores are earned. FREESTYLE: Freestyle tapes (cassettes or CDs) must be given to the announcer at least <u>two hours</u> before the scheduled ride time.

TESTS: This show will use the 2015 USEF and the current FEI tests and the 2015 USDF Introductory and Freestyle tests. USEF test sheets may be downloaded on the USDF Region 3 website: www.usdfregion3.org. The 2015 USDF Introductory and 2015 Freestyle tests may be downloaded from the USDF website: www.usdf.org. The 2017 western dressage tests and 2018 USEA Eventing tests will be used.

DRESSAGE DEFINITIONS AND ELIGIBILITY: Open: Anyone may ride in the Open division, including amateurs, professionals and Jr./Young Riders. Individuals are eligible to enter as **Juniors/Young Riders** until the calendar year in which they reach age 21. Competitors may compete as **Adults** from the beginning of the calendar year in which they reach age 22. (USEF DR 119.) Professionals must ride only in Open classes. **Green Horses** are those which have not reached their 7th birthday during the competition year. Horses under 36 months of age (to the day) may not be ridden in any dressage under-saddle class. Proof of horse's date of foaling must accompany entries of 3-year-old horses.

WESTERN DRESSAGE RULES AND GUIDELINES FOR WDAA SHOW #18-111

Western Dressage Rules and Tests are based in equine dressage fundamentals and showcase applications for the Working Western Horse. They were devised through a collaborative effort on the part of member feedback, the evaluation of respected horse people and equine organization and then revised and edited by a special division of our education committee. It is strongly recommended that western dressage riders wear approved safety helmets at all times while mounted.

The Rules are designed for use by judges and show managers, but also for riders of all experience level. See <u>www.westerndressageassociation.org</u>. The Rules are a wonderful educational tool with highlights that include gait descriptions, movements, goals and objectives – all of which lend to a progressive learning and training program regardless of intent to show or ride in any other discipline. They are mindful of the mission of the WDAA in which we honor the horse and provide a safe, comfortable and fair environment to explore the discipline.

WDAA AWARDS PROGRAM:

• WDAA Register Of Merit is awarded when the horse has earned 35 points

WDAA Register Of Achievement is awarded when the horse has earned 100 points

• WDAA Register Of Excellence is awarded when the horse has earned 200 points

• WDAA Bronze Medalist is awarded when the horse has earned 300 points with at least 5 tests submitted riding Level 1 or higher

• WDAA Silver Medalist is awarded when the horse has earned 400 points with at least 5 tests submitted riding Level 2 or higher

• WDAA Gold Medalist is awarded when the horse has earned 500 points with at least 5 tests submitted riding Level 3 or higher

• WDAA Supreme Champion is awarded when the horse has earned 700 points with at least 5 tests submitted riding Level 4 or higher

Points can be earned only at shows that are recognized by WDAA. The requirements for shows to qualify for recognition are not difficult, and the rewards can be very significant because owners and riders participating in the growing WDAA Points & Awards Program have special incentive to attend Recognized Shows. WDAA is now offering double points for scores earned at USEF-licensed shows for tests judged by USEF-licensed Western Dressage judges. GDCTA Hold Harmless Clause

The undersigned competitor and all signors below hereby (1) agrees to release the management of this show, their officers, directors, employees, members, or agents, and the owners or managers of the grounds where this event is held, from any loss, damage, liability, or injury arising out of or resulting from this show or competitors participation therein; (2) agrees to indemnify, hold harmless and defend the Georgia Dressage and Combined Training Association, Inc., the organizer, facility owner, and the management of this show from and against any and all claims for loss, damage, liability, or injury, however caused, resulting directly or indirectly from competitors entry or participation in this show or from acts or omissions of competitor or competitor's agents; and (3) acknowledges that activities with and around horses and horse shows involve inherent risks that are understood by the persons signing and are expressly assumed. In the event of injury to competitor or to competitor's animals permission is hereby granted to management for emergency medical treatment.

Every entry at a Georgia Dressage and Combined Training Association, Inc. (GDCTA) recognized competition shall constitute an agreement and affirmation that all participants (which include, without limitation, the owner, lessee, trainer, manager, agent, coach, driver, handler, and the horse), for themselves, their principals, representatives, employees, and agents: (1) shall be subject to the constitution and rules of the GDCTA and the local rules of the competition; (2) represent that every horse, rider, driver, and handler is eligible as entered; (3) agree to be bound by the constitution and rules of the United States Equestrian Federation (USEF) and of the competition, and will accept as final the decision of the hearing committee on any guestion arising under said rules, and agree to hold the competition, the GDCTA, their officials, directors and employees harmless for any action taken; (4) agree that as a condition of and in consideration of acceptance of entry, they authorize the GDCTA and the competition management to market, transfer, assign, or otherwise make use of any photographs, likenesses, films, broadcasts, cablecasts, audiotapes, or videotapes taken of the horse(s) and participant(s) while on the grounds, incident to, or in transit between the stabling facility and the event site, in any way they see fit for the promotion, coverage, or benefit of the event, sport, or the GDCTA, without compensation to any of them, so long as the use neither jeopardizes amateur status nor endorses a specific product or service, and hereby expressly and irrevocably waive and release any rights in connection with such use, including any claim to invasion of privacy, right of publicity, or to misappropriation; and (5) agree that they participate voluntarily in the competition fully aware that horse sports and the competition involve inherent dangerous risk of serious injury or death, and by participating they expressly assume any and all risks of injury or loss, and they agree to indemnify and hold harmless the GDCTA, the competition, and the officials, directors, employees, and agents from and against all claims including for any injury or loss suffered during or in connection with the competition, whether or not such claim, injury, or loss resulted, directly or indirectly, from the negligent acts or omissions of said officials, directors, employees, or agents of the GDCTA or competition. The construction and application of USEF Rules are governed by laws of the State of New York, and any action instituted against USEF must be filed in New York State, see Article 1502.5.
