STEAM Ahead at Amana Elementary School

Thursday, Feb. 13 at 6 p.m. you can learn more about the Amana Elementary STEAM magnet school program and see what the kids and teaching staff are up to as they STEAM ahead. Amana Elementary is a magnet school meaning it's a public school open to all students regardless of zip code. STEAM stands for a classroom and school emphasis on science, technology, engineering, art and math.

Following a highly successful pilot year, Amana Elementary is expanding the STEAM Magnet program to include Kindergarten, 1st and 2nd grades now with subsequent grades added each of the next couple of years.

All families, whether living in or out of the CCA School district, are invited to come to the Amana Elementary Feb. 13 and see what's happening. The informational session will include demonstrations of classroom activities.

Just a reminder: February 13 – April 1 priority magnet enrollment. Open enrollment is due March 1. Kindergarten round-up is April 30 at the Amana Elementary School.

To quote the informational brochure: CCA students who live within the Amana Elementary school resident attendance zone can automatically enroll in the Amana Magnet school. If CCA student lives outside the Amana resident attendance area wishes to enroll in the Amana Magent School, parents can indicate their interest on the CCA Online Registration.

Families outside of the Clear Creek Amana School District who would like to open enroll to attend Amana Elementary will need to follow open enrollment guidelines by the March 1 deadline. Transportation is provided for students living in the district.


