Amy Vu State Specialized Agent & Extension Agent II. Amy Vu is the UF/IFAS State Specialized Program Extension Agent in Apiculture, where she oversees all Extension activities related to honey bees and beekeeping. She runs the University of Florida Master Beekeeper Program, the University of Florida Bee Colleges, UF IFAS Honey Bee Blog, speaker requests, media inquiries, the lab's social media pages, provides programming and support for UF/IFAS faculty and staff across the state, and is the cohost of the lab's podcast "Two Bees in a Podcast"..

Dr. Judy Wu-Smart is the Extension and Research Entomologist at the University of Nebraska-Lincoln, Department of Entomology. The UNI, Bee Lab pursues research questions and extension programs focused on stressors impacting pollinator health in both managed and wild bee communities. We certainly appreciate Dr. Wu-Smart presentations at past Fundays, and we are most fortunate that she has accepted our invitation to share with us again.

Kim Mehalick is an engineer by day and beekeeper by night and weekend. She is an Eastern Apicultural Society (EAS) Master Beekeeper, past President of the Maryland State Beekeepers Association (MSBA), and is active in the Bowie-Upper Marlboro Beekeepers Association (mentoring program lead, manager of the teaching apiary), Anne Arundel Beekeepers Association (program lead) and DC Beekeepers Alliance (education committee). She is also a member of Montgomery County Beekeepers Association and Carroll County Beekeepers Association and regularly teaches a variety of topics for beginning beekeeping courses.

Eugene Makovec, Editor of American Bee Journal, is a 29-year, third-generation hobbyist beekeeper with about a dozen colonies. He is past-President of Three Rivers Beekeepers in St. Charles County, Missouri, has been active in several other local clubs and the Missouri State Beekeepers Association, and is the only two-time Missouri Beekeeper of the Year (2006 and 2015).

Eugene made a brief foray into politics in 2015, when he spearheaded a successful legislative effort to deregulate the sale of honey in Missouri — removing honey from the "jams and jellies" law (and beekeepers from their "food processor" status) and thus allowing thousands of the state's beekeepers to sell their product through retail outlets without needing to register for a commercial kitchen.
