Joanne reminded members about the 50's dance and the need for ticket sales

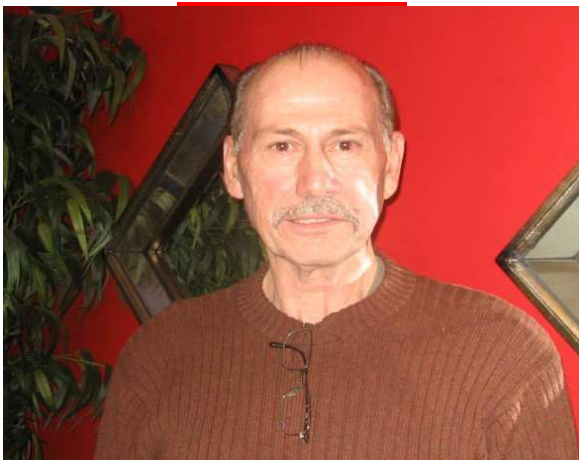
Carol Ehm reported on the upcoming Spring Cruise (see attached flyer).

My Thunderbird

I bought the TBird in the mid 70's and I am the second owner. After about 6 years I managed to save enough money to restore the Bird myself in my garage. I joined CTCI and tried to restore the Bird using CTCI's specifications. That is when I discovered that the Bird had a very rare paint code (S Code, non-factory color). It also has the rare factory fog lights, 312, dress up kit, 3 speed O/D and safety package interior with power windows. My wife and I started to show the car a few times and won some awards, among them the AACA First junior in 1987. We then started driving the car and enjoyed it for about 30 years.

About 4 years ago I decided to restore the car for the second time. Again, following all CTCI rules, I did the complete restoration in my own garage with the help of my wife and son. I even fabricated my own body rotator and spray booth. The project did take me around 2 1/2 years to complete. Once the car was completed my wife and I decided not to drive the car. We purchased a closed trailer and decided to just show the car for a few years. We have done very well with showing the car in 2016 - 2016 AACA First Place Grand National, 2016 PA TBird Convention Gold, 2016 Monmouth Cty Concours First Pace and First Place in the All TBird Show in Pompton Plains and several AACA award for Preservation

Technical

Battery Post Cleaner Solves Light Problems

Having trouble with the lights on your car? If they are not sufficiently grounded (intermittent lighting) the cause could be corrosion in the socket or the lamp base. A good cleaning can solve your problem. A good way to do this is to use a battery terminal wire brush cleaner. Insert the male end into the lamp socket and give it a few turns. Then stick the lamp base in the female end of the battery post cleaner and twist the bulb a couple of times. Works every time
