Ask Yourself these Questions

What do you want to study in college?

What degree path is important to you?

Are you willing to travel out of state to attend college?

Which states are you open to living in while attending college?

Do you want a college in an urban or rural area?

Do you want to be in a college town?

Are you open to playing college football on any level?

Are you open to attending a smaller school as compared to a big school?

Do you want to attend a public or private school?

Do you want to play for an NCAA team only?

Are you open to playing for an NAIA or JUCO team?

Are you open to playing on a partial scholarship if you do not receive a full offer?

Are you open to playing as a walk-on if you do not receive any scholarship money?

The college recruiting process is like being involved in a long interview process. You must go through the proper progressions. Just as you are considering many options, including your best fit and needs, so are the college coaches.
