Douglas C. Haldeman, PhD

Douglas Haldeman received a BA from the University of Washington, MA from Stanford University and PhD in Counseling Psychology from the University of Washington.

Currently the Director of Doctoral Program in Clinical Psychology (PsyD) and Professor of Psychology at John F. Kennedy University (APA Accredited) in Pleasant Hill, California, Dr. Haldeman is also a Trustee on the Board of the American Psychological Foundation, a Board Member of Rainbow Street (an LGBT refugee relief organization), and is the Past President of the California Psychological Association. He has previously been a member of the APA Council Leadership Team and the APA Board of Directors, a Clinical Instructor in the Department of Psychology at the University of Washington, and maintained an independent practice in counseling psychology in Seattle, Washington.

A very extensive list of scholarly publications, lectures, and trainings on issues of Psychological Assessment and Treatment, Diversity, LGBT, Ethics, Education and Training, and Refugee Mental Health are credited to Dr. Haldeman, including a number of publications on Conversion Therapy. He has been interviewed on numerous radio and television, is the Associate Editor of the *Journal of Lesbian and Gay Psychotherapy* and his book, *Sexual Orientation and Gender Identity Change Efforts: Evidence, Effects and Ethics*, is currently in preparation.

Samuel Brinton, MS

Samuel Brinton received his BS from Kansas State University and MS from Massachusetts Institute of Technology in Nuclear Science & Engineering.

Currently the Vice President of Advocacy and Government Affairs at The Trevor Project, Mr. Brinton worked on the formation of a campaign which revolutionized the anti-conversion therapy movement and submission of legislation in over 39 states and cities with successful passage of legislation in 20 states so far.

Mr. Brinton was featured in *TIME*, *Washington Post*, *Huffington Post*, *MSNBC*, *VICE*, and other outlets for LGBT activism. He has authored numerous publications related to his career in science and legislative issues.
