With Units processing membership online, they are not receiving their portion of the dues that were paid online. When members pay online, \$7 of Unit credit stays at Department for Department's portion of the dues.

Example: Unit dues are \$40, National sends Department \$22. Of the \$22, the Unit will receive \$15, \$7 stays at Department.

Due to keeping track of what credits are due to Units we are changing the process Units will receive their credits.

As of February 1, 2024, Department will begin issuing checks to the Units for the credits earned the month before. Except for the February check. We will be issuing unused credits on the February checks.

Checks will be processed once a month. The funds will be for the previous months' transactions.

We will be auditing what has been paid out so far. If you are owed credits from online payments we will mail the Unit a check.

Checks will be processed via Wells Fargo. They will be mailed to the mailing address on file at Department. Please check your mailing address in the 2024 directory and notify us if you would like to use a different mailing address.

The check you receive from Wells Fargo is good for 90 days. If the Unit does not cash the check within 90 days, the bank will notify us and the Unit will forfeit the money to Department.

AGAIN, if the Unit does not cash the check within 90 days, the bank will notify us and the Unit will forfeit the money to Department.

If Department makes an error processing the check, we will generate a second check to the Unit.

If you find your credits do not match Department's number, please contact us.

Legislative Update January 2024

Well, we made it. 2024 is here whether, we are ready or not.

There are 3 priority bills that are still being supported. You can continue to submit your support.

Pay Our Troops Act (H.R. 5641), which currently has 112 bipartisan cosponsors. The current continuing resolution expires November 17.

Additionally, we are giving our support to the *Keep Our Border Agents Paid Act* (S. 2999), which would ensure that U.S. Customs and Border Protection and U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement are paid in the event of a government shutdown.

Finally, Congress is running out of time to pass the *Afghan Adjustment Act* (H.R. 4627 *I S.* 2327). So please take the time to contact your representative and encourage them to support the *Afghan Adjustment Act*.

The house recently passed 3 bills supported by the Legion.

- The Cope ACT supports family care givers by the VA through training and counseling.
- The Elizabeth Dole Home Care- supports home healthcare for Veterans.
 increasing the number of affordable alternatives to VA nursing home care
- The Home Act- more funding to protect homeless Veterans. AKA the Housing Our Military Veterans Effectively Act, increases the maximum rate of per diem payments homeless veterans may receive.

The House and Senate Armed Services Committees announced that the conference for the fiscal year 2024 (FY2024) National Defense Authorization Act (NDAA) was completed. The 3,000 plus page document, details the appropriations for the Department of the Army, the Navy, and the Air Force, guides research and development within the Department of Defense, and determines personnel benefits and recruitment strategy.

A couple of things positive that came out of this was:

5.2% pay raise for service members which is the largest in 20 years! (Can you
imagine, not having a decent raise in 20 years and I am not even sure this is
decent, since some of our service members struggle with basic needs.)

 Improving living conditions on base (some of these barracks have not been updated in years) This also will also increase access to Base Housing Allowance.

American Legion Auxiliary VA&R REPORT TUCSON VA MEDICAL CENTER 11-30-23

Major changes to mask requirements have finally happened. We are working very hard with the Recreation therapists to get our traditional events back up and running. We need volunteers for the second Saturday for Bingo at the community Living Center. We need volunteers for the third Wednesday for Bridging at Building 90. Please contact me if your Unit can help.

Ward W2 (Dementia Ward) in Building 60 is currently seeking twin size blankets for their patients. They request that the blankets be different colors/patterns so each patient will recognize their personal blanket. Thank you Unit 8, Unit 62 & Unit 66 for your generous donations. They are also requesting clothing donations (sweatshirts and sweatpants all sizes especially size small in "girly" colors for the two female Veterans, socks and shoes men's sizes 9 and above). Many of the Veterans they serve come in with no clothing. One female patient in Building 60 is 106 years young.

Southwestern Blind Rehabilitation Center (SWBRC) is continuing going on outings where they are invited. They would like to request support for outings which are not direct donations such as going to the movies, Pima Air & Space Museum, Botanical Garden, etc. These outings must be financed by donations of the purchase of tickets directly by the sponsor. They currently have a population of twenty.

Patriot Pantry is up and running at is currently supporting 40 to 50 Veterans with food insecurities. The current monthly cost for this program is estimated at \$1,000. VA funds can now be used to purchase the food and different donors are shopping and delivering the items to SAVAHCS. There is also a Patriot Pantry program at the Sierra Vista CBOC. Thank you Unit 132 for your generous donation.

The grand total of monetary donations for the American Legion Auxiliary for May 1, 2023 to November 30, 2023 is \$872. Thank you Unit 32 for your generous donation to Fisher House.

The grand total of material and activity donations for the American Legion Auxiliary for May 1, 2023 to November 30, 2023 is \$9,744.59. Thank you Unit 62, Unit 109, Unit 131 and Unit 132 for your generous donations to support our programs.

Eight registered hospital volunteers donated time which was credited to the American Legion Auxiliary. The grand total of registered volunteer hours May 1, 2023 to November 30, 2023 is 569.5. We have on-boarded two new volunteers whose hours will benefit the American Legion Auxiliary. The Center for Development and Civic Engagement (CDCE formerly Voluntary Service) is bringing back many volunteers.

This chairman has volunteered 102 hours and logged 1,220 miles this year in service to the Tucson VA Medical Center as of November 30, 2023. This chairman has now logged over 4,000 hours in service to SAVAHCS. This chairman was reelected to be the Chairman of the Executive Committee of the VAVS Executive Committee at the meeting on October 12, 2021. This chairman has been elected to fill a three year term on the VAVS Executive Committee. This chairman has attended every Executive Committee meeting and every VAVS meeting this year. This chairman is working with the Homeless Program to ensure that our Homeless Veterans and those in Transitional Housing have the food and beverages that they need. This chairman is actively supporting the Patriot Pantry at SAVAHCS. This chairman is working with the Recreation departments to purchase needed supplies for the National Veterans Creative Arts Program and other recreational activities. National Veterans Creative Arts Festival was held August 22 & 23, 2023. I am also attaching the wrap up report for this year's festival. Annual Joint Review was completed November 28, 2023. VAVS Committee voted to fully fund transportation for the gold medal winners from NVCA at SAVAHCS on February 1, 2023. VAVS Committee voted to support the Patriot Pantry with a donation of \$3,000 on October 25, 2023.
