Program Highlights

- An optional 2-night Serengeti extension will be available on this itinerary to see the famous wildebeest river crossings on the Mara River.

Professional Interaction

- Focus on **music education curriculum**, access to band and choral classes in schools, and exchange knowledge with your counterparts.
- Spend time with faculty at Makumira University including a chance to attend a drumming workshop and an African dance class. The University at Makumira provides the only diploma program in Music and the Arts in all of Tanzania. Also visit the Uraki Secondary School.

Focus on the Community

- Spend time at the School of St. Jude, a non-governmental organization (NGO) providing educational services to the disadvantaged children of Arusha. Take part in various school activities including joining in a music and art class. You will also have a unique opportunity to visit a student's home and meet their family.
- Spend time with the founders of **Peter's Place.** The American couple has been living in Tanzania since the 1970's and were principal members of the Black Panther's Movement. Peter sought political asylum in Tanzania and together he and his wife, Charlotte, have built a community focused on improving and enriching the lives of local people with a heavy emphasis on preserving traditional
