Some unfortunately are transported about illegally and could show up in our area or in an area of your event. A well primed immune system is the best defense against transport stress and unwanted exposure. We recommend "Spring Shots" consisting of the encephalitis group (Venezualan, Eastern, Western and West Nile virus), Rabies (we are an endemic area for rabies), Rhino (Herpes virus of concern right now), Influenza (Flu), and in some cases Strep (Strangles). Take care of your horses and you help take care of our industry. We are here to help.

I am assuming David is also not going to St. Louis and not allowed to be a part of your program. As far as you losing a horse that was not Connors fault and you and everyone knows that including your groom. In fact - Connor said something to them and when he brought the horse back he completely took his tack off and your groom was suppose to wash him down because he took him from Connor and said he would take care of it. Dave said when he went to check on the horse - Benevta still had wraps on and had not been washed off and laying in stall. Dave started taking care of the horse. You even admitted it wasn't Connors fault and that you needed to teach them all about signs of dehydration. Not to mention the weather was too hot for polo that day anyway. If you want to set these rules into place and lose one of your best polo players and his brother, who has the potential to be one of the best ever then so be it. It better apply to every student. You will not treat my sons differently than your other students. You have 4 very upset parents here and a very upset young man in which you care nothing about. Connor brought you 3 students and how soon you forget. This isn't over as far as we are concerned. This is so wrong and I don't do well with wrong.

Vaughn- Dave has been riding since he was 3 years old and is very familiar with polo. He has told me not only is Connor one of the best polo player besides your A team. He said there in NO truth to Connor hurting your horses. Dave said Connor may not be the best rider but he is an incredible polo player and he certainly doesn't hurt your horses. Dave said he would know because he is very sensitive to that. Also- Connor may be getting older and you need him to buy tack but tack and buying a horse or two different things. You are his coach and you should have addressed his riding years ago if you felt he needed to work on it. It is a week before St. Louis and you tell him he can't go or be a part of your program....really? Dave was hauling your horses up for you and did last year. Therefore you wouldn't have been out any money hauling horses. Cindy mom was staying with my parents and Cindy. I have donated so much to your polo club that I don't even think you know how much I have donated. My parents opened their home for your kids last year to help save money for hotels and they offered the same this year: Connor has had a lot of coaches in his life and as much as he admired you - I am so disappointed. This is not the way a coach treats a player of Connors level and all we have done to support your program by bringing in new students. I am very surprised in your leadership or lack there of and I wasn't raised to treat people the way you are treating Connor. You have been his coach for 4 years. What you are doing is wrong and you know it. You should want kids to love this sport and do everything to encourage them to continue playing. I will assume every student that refuses to buy a horse will be asked to leave the program like Connor according to your email.

Needless to say don't expect Blake to be a part of your program. He will not be attending any classes or training based on how you just treated his brother. Too bad because Blake will be one of the best polo players in the country one day - mark my words. He already hits a back shot better than several teenagers in your program - you sons will vouch for that.

I will call Cindy and her mom Celia today and inform them that they need a hotel and Connor has been kicked out of your polo program.

Tammy,  
I can sell you the Elektra horse for the discounted price of \$10,000. He's worth \$15k, maybe more. You can pay it out in 4 monthly payments of \$2500 if you prefer.

It's time for Connor to have his own horse and Elektra is perfect for him. It's a great investment, unlike motocross, he has a real future in polo and a good chance to earn a college scholarship if he keeps working hard. Connor loves polo and it will be good for him to take "ownership responsibility" of his own horse. It will also be a good way for him to get onto our Varsity squad this coming year as we attempt to repeat the National Championship. I won't guarantee he will get on Varsity but all things being equal I will lean towards him making the squad if he owns a horse.

Connor's polo has improved a lot, he's gotten bigger and stronger and plays well.

However his riding skills haven't kept up with his polo skills, he's too tough on the horses. If you commit to buy Elektra I will personally spend some one-on-one time with riding, we will "short work" horses together over this summer and I'll teach him what he needs to do be

a great rider.

Also, I will include in his \$500 monthly program fee the hay, feed, water & shavings for Elektra, you will only have to cover shoeing and vet bills which is typically minimal. I also require that you keep Elektra stabled at Prestonwood while Connor is in our polo program. This is to ensure the health, both mental and physical, of the horse while he plays it in our program. When Connor goes to college he can give Elektra to Blake or take Elektra with him and play at College. Most college polo programs love it when players bring their own horses and they too lean towards putting those players with their own horses on the starting team.
