FROM NATIONAL...If you have received emails from AMWINS about insurance it is real not a scam. They have assumed all of National's Hartford policies.

Dues will be going up...it was a topic at Mid-Year NEC meeting 3-5-2022. Don't be surprised at Convention. The National per capita dues shall be eighteen dollars (\$18.00) per annum for Senior members beginning in Fiscal Year (FY) 2024, with a one dollar (\$1.00) increase in FY 2026 (\$19.00), FY 2028 (\$20.00) and FY2030 (\$21.00) National Junior member dues remain at two dollars and fifty cents (\$2.50) per annum with a \$.50 (fifty cent) increase in FY2026 to three dollars (\$3.00) per annum, FY2028 (\$3.50), and FY2030 (\$4.00)

CONSTITUTION AND BYLAWS

APRIL 2022

With elections right around the corner now is the time to take a good look at your governing documents. They should be specific to your unit; do not cut and paste from the national Constitution & Bylaws!

On the Department website: **aladeptaz, org** you will find the template that can be used to update the Unit Constitution, Bylaws and Standing Rules.

Well-written governing documents should provide leadership with the guidance needed. So, find and read your unit or department constitution, bylaws, and standing rules to make sure they follow Department and National changes.

The members of your executive committee or board — typically your officers but check your bylaws — have legal responsibilities: the duty of care, duty of obedience, and duty of loyalty. You now must transition from thinking "This is how I feel I should act" about a situation to "What action is legally expected from my position?"

IDEA:

Bring a copy with you to every meeting. Yes, every board/unit meeting. It is amazing how many of members do not have a copy of the most recent Unit/District Constitution, Bylaws and Standing Rules.

THANK YOU so very much each and every one of you that took your valuable time and efforts working with assigned schools to get delegates and alternates into this year's program.

Two years of virtual Girls State did present some problems getting back into schools, but they were met head on and the results were amazing; cards notarized, boxes signed and required information filled out. We still need to work on getting pictures, signatures of school staff and Unit signatures, but many of those issues were better this year. We also will need to work on **DEADLINE** to be turned in by **March 1st**. We will continue to use this date in the future. As some of you found out, once you get past Mach 1st, you had Spring Break and test to contend with. A reminder, school allotments were changed this year because of the increase with insurance costs. Some schools were used to having Unit members interview those wanting to attend and that did not happen this year. Things change each year in the program.

Now that delegates/alternates are in the database, the next step will be mailing out information for the Samsung Scholarship. National has made many changes to what is now required to submit an application. All applications are done online by the delegate, must be completed by June 5th and as much time as possible will be needed to complete all the requirements.

Since we are going from virtual to in person, we need to get our feet firmly planted again with the information that is provided to the delegate and their parents. In the past we have used orientations to make that happen. This year we will not do total District orientations but a mixture of in person and virtual presentations. Each District will not be required to provide a date for an orientation. I will be in contact next month (April) for what is the best way for your District to handle an orientation. Some of you will still be provided with the orientation material. I know many of you are so worried about what is going to happen with orientations and have talked among yourselves without knowing the facts. Sometimes we need to wait until discussions and decisions have been made by the proper person. Just because we have done things in the past a certain way does not mean that is what we are doing things this year.

In May we will be sending the medical cards and **COVID** paper to each delegate. This year more than in the past, we need to make sure those attending are healthy. It is a well check and delegates will bring all the required information to Girls State with them.

If any of you have an alternate that you would like to get into the program, please call me with that request. We will try to get in as many as we can.

Hope this information will be useful and you heard it from me and not from others. Again, I thank you so very much for all you do and have done to make Arizona Girls State the **BEST STATE IN THE LAND!**

Greetings,

I hope this finds all of you in good health and spirits. Did you watch the President's State of the Union Address on March 1? Speaking of the President, as of March 15th he signed a \$13.6 billion spending package in aid to Ukraine which got bipartisan support. The deal includes \$4 billion for refugees, \$2.5 billion for food and healthcare, and roughly \$3 billion for military and intel support.

Mid Term elections are just around the corner. Remember to get your members and members of the community to get out and vote. The ticket for Governor is very long, on both parties. I have seen a lot of activity going in and out of the Governor's Office and Secretary of State's Office. This will be an interesting primary. Primary Candidate and current State Treasurer Kimberly Yee has withdrawn from the run for Governor, but others are popping up. The Secretary of State's Office has been buzzing with candidacy appointments with candidates turning in their petitions and paperwork. On March 15th, Kari Lake turned in her paperwork for Governor Run. Earlier this month, Senator Wendy Rogers from Flagstaff was censored by her own party for comments made by her that were threatening her colleagues in the Arizona Senate. This really has no effect, other than she in layman's terms has been put on notice and that her negativity will not be tolerated.

Your End of the Year Reports ARE due into the Department Chairman by May 1, 2022.

Reports must include a narrative with a cover sheet to be considered for an award.

In closing, please stay healthy and positive. Remember, we are all in this together. Please remember, to be kind and patient with one another. SPECIAL PROJECT April 2022 Bulletin

There are three main goals when it comes to Post Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD) therapy: to Improve your symptoms, teach you skills to deal with it and to restore your self-esteem. To meet these goals, there are various types of treatment that individuals can go through. Examples of treatment include Cognitive Processing Therapy (CPT), Prolonged Exposure (PE) Therapy, Eye Movement Desensitization and Reprocessing (EMDR), Stress Inoculation Training (SIT), and Medications. Most PTSD therapies fall under the umbrella of cognitive behavioral therapy (CBT).

A type of therapy I have read about, and would like to focus on this month is called Prolonged Exposure (PE). PE will start with learning breathing techniques to ease the anxiety when you think about the traumatic event. Later, a therapist will help you work through a list of things you've been avoiding and learn how to face them, one by one.

What is prolonged exposure?

Prolonged exposure, or "PE" is a trauma-focused psychotherapy that teaches you to gradually approach memories and situations associated with the trauma. There are two types of exposure in this treatment: one is "imaginal" which involves telling your therapist about your memories of the trauma. The other one is "in vivo," which involves actually facing people, places and things you may have been avoiding since the trauma.

Why try prolonged exposure?

While facing memories or situations associated with trauma may not sound appealing, avoidance keep people stuck in PTSD. PE is about finding ways to deal with distress caused by trauma triggers you may experience in life. By doing this gradually and repeatedly with the support of your therapist, you can decrease the amount of distress you experience and start to live a fuller life.

A common fear about PE is that PTSD will worsen at first but research shows this only happens in a minority of cases. And even in those cases, people still experience the benefits of this treatment. In fact, prolonged exposure has been shown to be one of the most effective treatments for PTSD.



American Legion Auxiliary YEAR-END IMPACT REPORT FORMS

Why report these numbers?

Every hour, every dollar ALA members invest in our mission of helping veterans adds up. It not only gives each member a sense of pride, but it allows us to demonstrate our effectiveness to the world. Each small sum of numbers gets added into the collective numbers that are called Impact Numbers. These numbers proclaim our impact and make membership in the ALA meaningful.

These numbers are also reported to The American Legion, which includes them in its annual report to Congress. To make this process easier for you, it has been simplified and the form has been condensed to essential information. If you aren't sure, even giving an estimate is better than not reporting at all.

How to complete the Impact Report Form

- 1. **Each ALA member** should fill out the Member Form and give it to the unit president. This probably happens in April, but check with your unit.
- The unit president (or designee) compiles all of the member data on the Unit Form and adds any additional data not reported individually by unit members. This form then gets forwarded to either the district/county (if applicable) or department, which compiles all the records.
- 3. It is more important that you report information in one section of the form only rather than worry if you have selected the right category. For example, if you provide a service for children, it should go in either Service for Military Families (for example, camps for military children only) or Service for Children & Youth (Legion Family camps for all children) but not in both places.
- 4. Please round to whole dollar values (for example, \$149.50 should be \$150).

Report Simplifications

- All service for all military whether active duty, retired, or reserve component is now combined in one section.
- 2. Each section has better defined examples of the service that should be reported.
- For Units, Districts/Counties, and Departments:
 "Line numbers" and "Obtain Total From" columns assist in transferring data from form to form. For example, units can find the number of Volunteer Hours for Military Families on Line 5 of the Member Form.

FAQs

Question:

Where do I report my service for a National Guard "Welcome Home" activity?

Answer:

Service for ALL members of the military, whether they are retired, active-duty or in the reserve component such as the National Guard is now reported in "Section 1: My Service for Veterans,

Active-Duty, and Reserve Military."

Question:

Do I report my VAVS (Veterans Administration Voluntary Services) on the Impact Form since I

already sign in at the VA when I volunteer?

Answer:

No, the ALA receives those hours from the VA on a yearly basis.

Question: Answer: Does time shopping for care packages for deployed military count as service? Yes, shopping for care packages counts as service hours under Section 1.

Question:

So.... does driving my daughter to Junior Meetings count as service?

Answer:

Sorry, that falls within your responsibility as a parent. You get kudos for being a great ALA

parent though!

Question: Answer: My unit volunteered at a summer camp for military kids. Where should I report this service? You may report service for summer camps open only to military kids under "Section 2: My ALA Service for Military Families." If the camp is open to ALL children, then your service would be reported under "Section 3: My ALA Service for Youth." But don't worry if you don't remember. Just report it somewhere... once!

Question:

My neighbor is deployed, so I help her husband by babysitting their children once a week. Does

this count?

Answer:

Absolutely! Report this under "Section 3: My ALA Service for Military Families."

Question:

What if I don't know exactly where on the form to report my service?

Answer:

You can always report it under "Section 4: My Service Representing the ALA in My Community."

Question: Answer:

Can I count hours spent taking care of a veteran who lives with me but is not a blood relative? As long as you are not receiving compensation in return for your role as a caregiver (such as when you care for your spouse), you may report it under "Section 1: My ALA Service for

Veterans, Active-Duty and Reserve Military."

Question:

Can I count hours spent preparing meals for Legion meetings and administrative support for

TAL commanders as hours spent in Service to Veterans?

Answer:

Those hours count but should be reported under "Section 4: My Service Representing the ALA in My Community." Some of our members aptly describe those activities as family chores.
