#### The Hope of Returning Home: Exile & Return

As we enter November, many of us feel the year drawing to a close. The holidays are fast approaching, and we will quickly be in the season where we long to gather in familiar settings.

This time of year is often reflective. We reflect on our journeys, the struggles we've faced, and the hope we hold for the future. For this month we will be looking at the Biblical theme of Exile and Return.

From Genesis to Revelation, the Scriptures tell a story of exile—a separation from God that begins in the Garden of Eden, stretches into Israel's captivity in Babylon, and finds its ultimate answer in the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ. Through the prophets, God calls His people back to Him, not only physically but spiritually, always reaching out to a world in need of healing and restoration.

Exile, in a spiritual sense, is the feeling of distance from God, a separation due to sin, suffering, or simply the challenges of life that weigh on us all. Like Israel in the wilderness or the people of Judah in Babylon, we have each felt that distance, that longing for a place and presence that truly feels like "home." And yet, God's promise to His people has always been this: I will bring you back.

The word of the Lord came to me: "Son of man, the people of Jerusalem have said of your fellow exiles and all the other Israelites, 'They are far away from the Lord; this land was given to us as our possession.'

"Therefore say: 'This is what the Sovereign Lord says: Although I sent them far away among the nations and scattered them among the countries, yet for a little while I have been a sanctuary for them in the countries where they have gone.'

"Therefore say: 'This is what the Sovereign Lord says: I will gather you from the nations and bring you back from the countries where you have been scattered, and I will give you back the land of Israel again.'

- Ezekiel 11:14-17

Throughout November, we reflect on this journey of exile and return, mindful of how it mirrors our own lives. We experience times of wandering, but God continually invites us back to Him, back to a renewed relationship, a restored heart, and a revitalized community.

And then as we draw near to Advent, we anticipate the fulfillment of this promise in a unique way. In just a few short weeks, we will begin the season that reminds us that, in Christ, God did not merely call His people home; He came to bring us home Himself. Emmanuel—God with us marks the ultimate return from exile, the moment when God stepped into our world to draw us back into His.

Let us prepare our hearts for the coming of Christ, who is not only the way back home but the light that guides us there.




November 10th: Our next Men's Breakfast will be Sunday, November 10th at 7:30 am in the church fellowship hall.




Congratulations to the following on the birth of their newest additions:

**Drop Box Available**

First Aid Equipment & Medical Supplies


#### **How Do I Give to the Church** and Its Ministries

- Give in App Download the Tithe.ly App from the App Store (iPhone) or Google Play Store (Android). Once you've downloaded the app, create an account or log in, locate our church and tap "Give Now" to complete your contribution.
