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## CHILDREN'S PROFILES



**Gani (born 9-20-09, HOPE):** This boy's father left the family some years back, which put the mother into a struggle to provide for she and her 3 boys. They're from a Hindu background. Gani is actually named Ganesh (elephant-head god with a fat human body, with a rat at his feet which he uses as his vehicle). We nicknamed him Gani, which he likes. His older brother, Simha, came into the boys home last year. Simha started wit-

nessing to his mother, and she's now seeking the true and living GOD. Hallelujah! The Holy Spirit has led us recently to start praying more for the salvation of our kids' relatives.

**Nithya (birthday unknown, HOPE):** Her parents were living in a very poor village on the outskirts of HOPE's town of Bapatla. All the homes are huts made out of whatever they can find to construct with. The father is an alcoholic and beating both the mother and 2 girls (Nithya's older sister, Charity, is already at HOPE). There's a lot of uncertainty as to the reality of their home situation, as the mother also disappeared for some time, suspected of being with another man. Another issue is that both Charity and Nithya seemed to be in danger of molestation, probably due in part because of the lack of proper oversight. Both girls were named after Hindu girls; we changed their names to Charity and Nithya ("eternal"). **Below** are HOPE girls, **Nithya** the little cutie bottom left.

**Dinakara:** “I am Dinakara, and would like to share a testimony about the persecution that happened in our district in 2008. I was going to the market in the evening, and saw a mob rushing towards me with axes, iron rods and knives. I became fearful and ran into the jungle (forest). I escaped, but in the night the mob went to our village and demolished Christian houses. The next morning I was able to find my family members with others in the forest. Only by the grace of GOD we were saved. I am sure GOD has a special plan upon my life to be useful for His glory. Please do pray for my ministry. Still now our believers are in fear. Thank you.”

**Jikhariya:** “I am Jikhariya, born and brought up in a Hindu family. My father became critically sick and was about to die. To save his life I went to many Hindu worship centers, but nothing happened. We then asked prayer from a pastor and my father was healed! We came to Christ, and GOD called me to the ministry. While involved in the ministry, persecution began coming against me. In my village, people were not talking with my family and the village people were planning to send us out of the village. While such things were happening, the great persecution came (in 2008), and we had big problems. However, GOD saved us and gave us a new fellowship to do His ministry. Now I am so happy to meet here in this pastors' fellowship. It's encouraging me much. Please do pray for my ministry, as still there are some problems coming against us.”

Below is a testimony from **Leah**, a girl in the Morning Star Girls Home, an example of many of the girls' past struggles.

"I first studied in a convent school. When the persecution happened over there (2008) I ran to the jungle and somehow reached my home. I was not able to continue my studies because after some months my father (*Bijaya Sanset, one of 7 believers falsely charged with murdering a Hindu priest, triggering a mass persecution in the area*) was taken to the prison.

After that some people came and took me to a hostel at Berhampur so I could study. There they kept me, but did not send me to the school. After some days the police came to the hostel and would not allow the hostel to continue, so I was sent back.

After that I was placed in a Katagada hostel with my younger sister Deepa to continue my studies. But in that hostel, though my mother was paying fees, I did not get enough food, and they were always shouting at me. They made me work even on the school days, and when I complained about this they drove me out of the hostel. (*In a different testimony, she added more details, such as the mistreatment of her little sister, Deepa. Also, the daughter of the person running the hostel was very abusive to the girls, kicking them in the side to wake them up, and sometimes stepping on their heads.*)

After this hostel, again I was taken to another hostel at Berhampur. That hostel was in a Hindu jungle area where many snakes were coming to the home. The Hindus did not allow anyone to kill the snakes because they were worshipping snakes. Here also I did not get a chance for studying, as they simply were keeping us at the hostel. In the night ghosts (*evil spirits*) were coming because it was next to a burial place (*cemetery*). There was not any prayers or meditation to the Lord. I started to have fear over there, and started crying. Then I became sick and my brother took me back to my home.

While I was in a Katagarh hostel, that time I was helped by the Morning Star ministry. My mother later requested that I get an opportunity in the MS girls home, and after some months I was called to have this privilege. Here I have so many opportunities. Previously I was not praying, not worshipping, not disciplined, not meditating on the Word of God, and not respecting elders. But here I am praying, learning the Word of God, songs, dances, loving the younger girls, respecting elders, getting peace. Everything is free for me; no need for me to do any work outside (*begging for fees, which other hostels were requiring*). I'm not fighting with others, and doing only good things by the grace of GOD."

\* We praise the Lord that a large donation was given in September, enabling us to continue on with construction on the new HOPE land in the village of Chinthayapalem. We're taking the compound wall to a higher level, then planning to fill the land with sand, raising the land level to avoid flooding.

\* GOD touched the heart of one donor to provide sweaters and blankets for all the Manna Program members, as well as sweaters for 25 HOPE children. What a blessing! We're still in the rainy season, and the temps should be going down some soon. There's a total of 129 widows, elderly and handicapped the Lord is using the Manna Program to assist with food and other items (108 in the HOPE region, and 21 widows with the Morning Star).

\* Continue to pray the Lord will give us a Godly and loving person (or couple) to live and work with our HOPE girls. We have plenty of workers for a salary, but need those who hear the call of GOD to do this ministry with us with a servant's heart.

\* We have pastors with whom we do ministry (mostly they oversee some of the MP elderly) who have other ministry needs. Especially pray for Brother Prabhakar Rao, needing to rebuild his collapsing church (a large hut), maybe 4 or \$5,000. He does ministry in about 15 villages (mostly poor tribal people) with his son.

### **More News From the Morning Star:**

**Below** is the most recent photo we have of the MS Girls Home. As you may remember, the India government required the MS ministry to build a larger room for the girls, along with a mandate to provide a cot, mattress and more bed sheets for each girl. The Lord has wondrously provided via one of our faithful donors. PTL!

Brother Kisan, one of the main leaders of the MS, as well as the primary overseer of the girls home, is planning to get married in November. The bride-to-be is ministry-minded and looking forward to coming to their small village and working with the 25 girls in the home, as well as the other ministries that Morning Star is connected with. We see this as an answer to prayer, as the girls home there has been lacking a Godly woman who has a burden for the girls, and who is gifted to work with them regularly.

Sister Buelah is planning to take 8 of the HOPE girls to the Morning Star area to participate and enjoy the wedding functions (I also going if I get permission from the local govt. officials there). Pray for our journey, and that the Lord will be glorified in all things.
