## Preaching to the Choir

July marks the beginning of my second year as pastor of Aledo United Methodist Church, and I'm so very thankful that Bishop Frank Beard discerned that I should serve this congregation. In response, I'm using this one-year anniversary as an opportunity to reflect on the past year.

One of the challenges facing a pastor in a new church is adapting his ministry to a new context. It also happens that understanding one's context was a critical component to my Doctor of Ministries studies.

One of the adaptations I've made has been prompted by our weekly broadcast over WRMJ radio, 102.3 FM. This is the first church I've served which broadcast its services over a local radio station. I've heard from many of you how much our radio broadcasts have meant to you, especially during a pandemic. However, several months ago it dawned on me that many of our listeners were not members of our church. They may not have been Methodists or even Christians.

I realized that I'd spent most of my career "preaching to the choir." In other words, I've spent most of my career assuming that my audience was made up of followers of Jesus Christ. That's because my audience was almost always seated in the pews in front of me and was made up of members of whatever church where I was preaching. But broadcasting our services has changed my assumptions. What about the truck driver passing through our area on I-80? WRMJ has quite a reach; I've picked it up in Davenport, 40 miles away.

Facebook has an even further reach than WRMJ, unless you choose to listen to our local radio station online at [WRMJ.com](http://WRMJ.com).

As I became more aware of our audience outside of the walls of our church, I decided to include a "sinner's prayer" at the end of each broadcast service. I've kept it rather low-key, but I think it's of vital importance. And I didn't stop with the broadcast service. I realized that some of those seated in our pews may need to pray that prayer as well, so I decided to include it in all three of our services. I plan to continue that practice indefinitely.

I'm sharing this with you because I want you to know that should you invite someone to our church, your guest will have the opportunity of praying a sinner's prayer in a rather low-key manner.

You'll also notice that I almost always use the language of *following Jesus* as opposed to the language of *asking Jesus into your heart*. While I fully appreciate that idea, I prefer the language of following Jesus. Asking Jesus into your heart sounds like a one-time event. I've met people who had asked Jesus into their hearts thirty years earlier and hadn't connected with Christ since then. However, following Jesus is a lifelong journey.

In Matthew 28:19, Jesus commissions us to make disciples, and you must follow Jesus to become a disciple. After all, I believe that Jesus is on the move in our church and in our community, and if you stop following him, and Jesus keeps moving, then it won't be long before he will have moved on and left you in the dust.

I hope you'll continue to join me in this life-long journey of following Jesus. And I hope you'll invite your friends to join us. That's what connecting people to Jesus Christ is all about.

## Connecting with the Word

As followers of Jesus Christ, we are shaped by the Word, remembering that Christ revealed himself as the Living Word. We will continue to follow the scriptures suggested by the Revised Common Lectionary (RCL), and those scriptures are listed below. Each week, I encourage you to read the passages suggested for each Sunday in order to prepare your hearts for worship, whether in-person, on the radio, or on Facebook. Kathleen's Children's Moments will be drawn from each Sunday's Gospel reading.

We begin the month on Independence Day, Sunday, July 4. We will celebrate our freedom by receiving Holy Communion during all three services. If you're joining us virtually, please have some bread and grape juice ready. The elements may not be properly consecrated, but Christ will be properly remembered. Scriptures include 2 Samuel 5:1-5, 9-10; Psalm 48; 2 Corinthians 12:2-10 and Mark 6:1-13.

Scriptures for Sunday, July 11 include 2 Samuel 6:1-5, 12-19; Psalm 24; Ephesians 1:3-14; and Mark 6:14-29.

Sunday, July 18 we'll be celebrating "Christmas In July," so our scripture lessons will include the story of the birth of Christ. The RCL also suggests 2 Samuel 7:1-14a; Psalm 89:20-37; Ephesians 2:11-22; and Mark 6:30-34, 53-56.

We wrap the month up on July 25 with 2 Samuel 11:1-15; Psalm 14; Ephesians 3:14-21; and John 6:1-21.

## INDEPENDENCE DAY



During the American Revolution, the legal separation of the American colonies from Great Britain occurred on July 2, 1776, when the Second Continental Congress voted to approve a resolution of independence that had been proposed in June by Richard Henry Lee of Virginia. After voting for independence, Congress turned its attention to the Declaration of Independence, a statement explaining this decision, which had been prepared by a committee but with Thomas Jefferson as its principal author. Congress debated and revised the Declaration, finally approving it on July 4, 1776. A day earlier, John Adams had written to his wife Abigail: “The second day of July, 1776, will be the most memorable epoch in the history of America. I am apt to believe that it will be celebrated by succeeding generations as the great anniversary festival. It ought to be commemorated as the day of deliverance, by solemn acts of devotion to God Almighty...from one end of this continent to the other, from this time forward forever more.” Adams' prediction was off by two days!

In a remarkable series of coincidences, both John Adams and Thomas Jefferson, two founding fathers of the United States and the only two men who signed the Declaration of Independence to become president, died on the same day: July 4, 1826, which was the United States' 50th anniversary. President James Monroe died exactly five years later, on July 4, 1831.

We have much to be grateful for in this country. Celebrate our nation’s independence- thank God for our freedom!
