OLD BUSINESS

-Wayne Burgess presented awards to Ward Sevila & Bob Sydnor from the Tidewater Region Show. Both had won 1st place in their classes. Then Ward explained to membership how the classes work.

-Ward thanked the club for the roast that was given to him at Bella's restaurant.

-Minutes from last meeting were motioned to approve, seconded, and approved.

-Treasurer's report was read, motioned to approve, seconded, and approved.

-Car Show – Ward said the judging class that Brent Gatton gave, was fun and productive to add uniformity to our show judging. He also said that he has applied for the insurance for the show through AACA. Brent Gatton gave a report on the raffle figures and said we were a little over the break-even mark and tickets sold from here on out, will be profit. He also said the materials (tiny roller skate) for Stan's trophy were received from Stan and ready to make a neat trophy for Stan to give out. Brent went over the sign-up sheet and demanded everyone be on the field by 6:30 a.m. and that there is plenty to do for everyone. Brent said that the hospitality tent should have water on hand. Peyton Guest asked if he should get the water and Brent answered yes. Terry Minter said he would have water on his golf cart too. Brent also reminded everyone who will help set up the field on Friday, to be there at 10 a.m. Brent told the judges who had taken the judges class, to pair up with those who had not taken the class. Ward suggested each head judge comb the field for their partner. Ward is doing the award presentation. Brent asked "what are we doing about fire extinguishers this year? Last year, Bob Sydnor had talked about buying some to sell." Ward answered "they will have to worry about their own fire extinguishers". Paul Stosch reported that the funeral home will bring and set up the tents. Brent said Bill Lewis confirmed that the band will play from 10:30 – 1:30. Brent is to ask Bill to bring his PA. That would make it one less thing Brent & Sherry have to carry to the field. Earl Beauchamp said, "back on fire extinguishers – the registration desk should remind people that they need to have their fire extinguishers". Ward announced he wants all ads for the program in and monies collected thus far is \$3,745.95 .

-By-Laws – Ward said that the By-Laws process has been the most trying time for him. He said is going to only moderate and wants everyone to keep their comments short. He asked if everyone got the By-Laws? Wayne Burgess motioned to approve. Gloria

Burgess seconded. Ward asked if there was any discussion? Charlene Schnakenberg asked, "how was the At Large position voted on as a position without the position being in the By-Laws?" Ward answered the "At Large position was made to get someone on the board to start learning." Charlene asked, "When was the At Large position given to the general club as an open position?"

Ward

answered "it was up to the Nominating Committee". Charlene said, "the At Large position was not voted on until the Banquet". Ward said, "it was a business meeting". Charlene said, "people should be able to go to a board member and ask questions without the need for an At Large position". Ward said "that person has already offered good input". Charlene said, "it's not necessary to have an At Large position. Peyton said "I don't know how many people have served on the Nominating Committee, but it's hard to get people to be a volunteer. This time, we had someone to volunteer. And this is the first time someone volunteered as an extra." Earl said, "the At Large person could be the one to present the other people's comments to the board. As Founder, I see the By-Laws as virtually perfect." Dwayne Schnakenberg said, "I don't see the purpose of the At Large position. General members should be able to come to board meetings when they have something important they want to present and be given 5 minutes. Other members could do

what the proposed At Large person could do. I prefer no At Large position." Ward says, "we have a person to be a future board member, not just a person who speaks at a meeting here and there". Wayne Burgess said, "the At Large position has no voting rights". Bob Sydnor said, "At Large does not mean the person is a shoe in – they have to be voted in". Charlene said, "well I do not like how this was done". Ward said "Charlene, I just can't help that". He also said "if that At Large position had been available, I would have rather have taken that first". Judy Beauchamp said, "everyone on the board has a one year term". Ward read Dave & Cindy Franklin's letter stating their concerns about the club not meeting IRS requirements to maintain a non-profit status and that they may resign from the club depending on the outcome. Ward said Dave is articulate and positive regarding education and the IRS. Ward injected "social welfare is a vague area as acknowledged by the IRS." Earl says "showing cars is showing how they are made and that is educational. We are providing historical information, unless they are modified." Earl says "this has been deemed educational by the IRS. And, the club was never formed for charity, and I'm proud of it." Dwayne said "Ward and I spent quite a bit of time with Janice who has experience with IRS audits, etc. We will be OK with a C4 status because people may ask a question about a car, and that would be considered education." Sherry Gatton asked "since the club has a lot of money in the bank, doesn't that represent profit and we are trying to be a non-profit organization?" Dwayne answered "as long as we have under \$50,000.00 in assets,

then we comply with the IRS". Gloria Burgess said, "there's a vote on the floor". Majority vote won for the By-Laws to be accepted as presented. It was seconded and approved. Wayne wanted everyone to give a hand to Dwayne for going through the By-Laws process. Bob Sydnor said, "By-Laws are subject to change". Ward said "to those who commented, it was appreciated, but I'm glad it's over".

-Surrey Girls Charity – report was read by Ted Thomas for Dave and Cindy Franklin. TJs event raised \$580.00. Raffle sales at the VFW for the pedal car and popcorn popper were \$98.00 . There will not be a Sock Hop because there was not much interest shown by the club. The Surrey Girls committee will be eliminated after the car show.

-Picnic grounds – Gloria Sydnor said, "it will be at Pat Givens church (Cobhan Baptist Church) off Route 3, outside Warsaw. If it is on a Sunday, it has to be after 1:30." Mr. Givens suggested 2:00 – 4:00 on August 9th. It was motioned, seconded, and approved.

NEW BUSINESS

Newsletter competition – Ward said that he was informed by National, that Caitlin must be a member in order to compete in the competition. She can be a student member for \$12.00 . It was motioned for the club to pay for it (Ted preferred the club did not), motion was seconded and approved.

ACE Hardware – Ward talked to Nancy who said set aside October 24th for the Cruise-In there. Motioned to attend, seconded, and approved. October 17th is the fall back date.

National dues – are now half price. Any new members acquired from now to the end of the year will not have to pay anything which means the club will pick it up. . No, new members will pay half price but we will waive the NNK Region dues as we have always done.

Philadelphia trip – was discussed. Ward noted a picture of Earl & Judy's bricks. Ward said "Wayne has mentioned before, his desire for the club to purchase a brick at National". Wayne said "now that a group from our region has seen the library and it operates on donations". Ward encouraged everyone to go see the library and museum and he said, "it's beautiful". Motion was submitted to buy a large brick for \$250.00 . It was seconded and approved. Earl said Judy donated an afghan with the AACA logo crocheted in the middle. Ward asked "what does the club think about reducing dues by \$5.00 and proposes a budget in the future?" Sherry said, "when I did the newsletter and it went over a certain number of pages, I was told that the dues were not enough to cover extra postage. So, why would you want to reduce dues?" Earl said, "she's right".

Emmerton – September 19th (This is a historic house tour sponsored by the Richmond County Museum.

Details to follow.) It was motioned to attend, seconded, and approved.

Heathville Tavern – Farmers market and cruise-in is Saturday 16th 10-2 .

Carrington – Is June 5th.

Ward said now this is open conversation time. Dwayne Schnakenberg mentioned a 1919 Chevy for sale for \$8,500.00 with an extra engine. Ward said he knows of someone with a 1936 Pontiac for sale for \$25,000.00 .

Someone asked if it was OK if a motorcycle entered our show and everyone seemed to think that was OK.
