WHAT DO I DO IF I SUSPECT CES?



- 1. Assess symptoms against the **NSCESP triage tool**
- 2. If symptoms could represent CES as per triage tool assess duration
- 3. If duration more than 2 weeks
 - a. **DO** Refer to MSK / interface services urgently mark referral as urgent and that patient has > 2 weeks of symptoms consistent with suspected CES
 - b. **DO NOT** not send to ED
 - c. DO NOT not refer emergently for an MRI scan
- 4. If duration less than 2 weeks
 - a. DO refer to your local secondary care service as per your established pathway for CES
- 5. If symptoms not representative of CES as per triage tool
 - a. DO NOT send to ED
 - b. **DO NOT** refer emergently
 - c. Safety net patient (consider literature below) and refer for the symptoms to MSK/interface services if appropriate. Consider other causes for symptoms

WHAT DO I DO IF AN MRI REPORT SUGGESTS RADIOLOGICAL CES?



- 1. CES is a clinical syndrome NOT radiological
- 2. Radiology supports a clinical diagnosis
- 3. **DO NOT** send to ED nor refer emergently to secondary care on call services without further assessment
- 4. DO a same day assessment of the patient and screen for symptoms of CES as per NSCESP triage tool
- 5. If no symptoms consistent with CES:
 - a. Safety net patient and **DO** refer urgently to elective spine surgical services with the current symptoms and the MRI findings
 - b. **DO NOT** send to ED
 - c. **DO NOT** not refer emergently
- 6. If symptoms could represent CES as per triage tool assess duration
- 7. If duration more than 2 weeks
 - a. **DO** refer to elective spine services URGENTLY mark referral as urgent and that patient has > 2 weeks of symptoms consistent with suspected CES and MRI findings
 - b. **DO NOT** send to ED
 - c. It is reasonable to take advice from on call services as per your local pathway
 - d. **DO NOT** refer to MSK services as imaging is complete and positive; so a spine surgical opinion is appropriate
- 8. If duration less than 2 weeks
 - a. DO Refer to your local secondary care service as per your established pathway for CES
