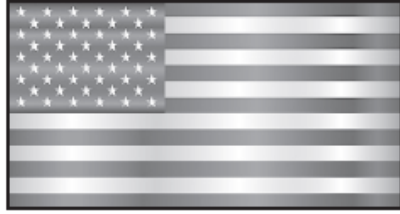


Kenneth Robert Gray
