Pastor's Corner

November is here. This might be the month that *zips by the fastest*; even before Halloween, the stores are lined with Christmas products and paraphernalia. Sorry “Mr. Turkey” – you never stood a chance. *[Don't worry, I'm going to go light on my "It's not even Advent yet!" ranting this year – good to take a break]*. But one thing it's not good to take a break from is **thanksgiving**. Back in September I challenged the congregation to start a “gratitude” list (for every year you've been alive, you list one thing you can regularly be grateful for), and then go through the list once a week. I wonder how many have compiled and recounted the various blessings over the last 40 days ... For some (the youngest in our youth group), this would mean 11 things, for some it would mean 46 things, and for others it would mean 89 things! Some of the things I've added to my list in the last few weeks include:

- *reliable members of the church who volunteer for ministry when needed
- *volunteers who step into greater leadership roles and seize opportunities to serve
- *congregational gestures of appreciation (like the Pastor's Appreciation card – thank you!)
- *beautiful weather for community events, which God has used for beautiful things

Don't wait until you're sitting around the family table on November 27th to ask, “What are we thankful for?” Why? Because if we ask and answer that question now,

and if we share with others the blessings in our lives, it shapes our thinking, and then our thinking will shape our behavior – like how we go about the work of voting on Election Day – you might think the two have little to do with each other, but a deeply cultivated gratitude can help us do work that we otherwise would groan and say, “Uh! I don't have the bandwidth to give more effort into that.” C'mon, admit it (at least internally) we mumble things like that – I know I do sometimes. But I think those things more often when I've been focused on how *I want things to be* ... instead of being grateful and thankful for the good things that are. All of this is to say, when we practice Paul's instruction in Ephesians 5:17-20 - which ends, “Make melody to the Lord with your heart, giving thanks always and for everything to God” – then it won't just be about a day with the family with good food on the table, it will be about letting the good that “falls from the Master's table” (*Matt. 15:27-28*) spread to others, bless others, and bring glory to God. So, don't let this flash of a month sprint by too quickly; let the blessings around you prepare you for what's next.

A Devotional for You - Read *Romans 12:12-21*

Some of you know that I have been thinking a lot lately about justice. Maybe it's because Election Day was approaching (now here), maybe it's the exhausting stalemate of the government shut down (day 23 as I write this), maybe it's the ongoing drama with the peace agreement in the Middle East, maybe it's because of the gross lack of other "coverage" of other tragedies and atrocities (like what's happening to people in Nigeria, Sudan, Myanmar), which are being passed over in global news which is focusing on the "bigger war issues" ... maybe it's the combination of all these things. So, I have been going to some of the Church's prophetic voices for perspective. Let me share two for your devotional time today.

From C.S. Lewis in the collection of essays titled, *The Weight of Glory*: "I have received no assurance that anything we can do will fully eradicate suffering. I think the best results are obtained by *people who work quietly and consistently away at limited objectives*, such as the abolition of [human trafficking], or prison reform, or [dementia], not by those who think they can achieve *universal* justice and peace. I think the art of life consists in tackling each immediate evil as well as we can ... The dentist who can stop one toothache deserves better of humanity than all the men who think they have some scheme for producing a perfectly healthy race" *[brackets mine]*

Second by N.T. Wright in his book, *Evil and the Justice of God*: "This is why genuine Christian theology is itself a *redemptive* activity. The effort to understand and articulate the way in which the Creator is gloriously right both to have made the world in the first place and to have redeemed it in just this way [the crucifixion and resurrection of Jesus] is itself part of the stewardly vocation of genuine human existence, bringing God's order into the minds and hearts of others and thereby enabling people both to worship the true God and to service his continuing purposes" *[page 141, brackets mine]*.

Let me end by offering a *Prayer* to use, taken from those "American Reformers" – the Puritans: "You call for my heart, Lord Jesus. Oh that it were in any way fit for your acceptance! I am unworthy, Lord, everlastingly unworthy to be yours. But since you will have it so, I freely give up my heart to you. Take it; it is yours. Oh that it were better! But Lord, I put it into your hand, who alone can mend it. Mold it after your own heart. Make it as you would have it to be—humble, heavenly, soft, tender, and flexible. I trust alone in the value and virtue of your sacrifice, knowing that you will always intercede for me. Amen." (Joseph Alleine in *Piercing Heaven: Prayers of the Puritans*, Lexham Press, page 150)

## **From the Hearts & Hands of Puckety's Elders, Deacons, and Leaders**

*[Some highlights of the October Session meeting]*

\***Natural Gas Lease** – Redstone Presbytery has approved Puckety to enter into the gas lease with EQT (formerly Olympus Energy). Our property is over where the 'radial arms' of the extraction veins (5,000 to 7,000 feet deep), but the wells are 3.6 miles away. The offer is a 5 year lease, with a signing bonus expected to be \$3,000 per acre (roughly 6 acres) and royalties are 16% of the net.

\***The Upkeep Team** has been BUSY. They researched and recommended bids for repair projects – all approved by Session: 1) the repair of the Faith Hall roof (including roof, gutter, downspouts, gutter guard) and sheds – Andrew Construction won the bid - estimated start of work for last week of October/first week of November ... 2) Faith Hall entrance ramps and steps – new design and configuration – bid reviewed and awarded to Scheftic Construction (with another sub-contracting company working in tandem) with a goal to be done before December/snowfall ... 3) in cooperation with the Fellowship & Care Team (subcommittee of 2 to 3 members from each) research is being conducted for the selection of new chairs and/or tables, using the profits from the Apple Dumpling Sale and the donation from the "On the Move" program – that combined revenue total being the budget. The Upkeep Team has multiple other projects in view and have ranked them based on priority. The Session extends our gratitude for their work and service.

\***Budget** – the Session reviewed and discussed all the various projected 2026 Budgets of the various church committees/teams. We took the time to go through each section of the proposed budgets and appreciated the comments and explanation of the chairs and liaisons. We will have the final reading and vote of the final 2026 Budget at the November Session meeting, which will be presented to the congregation on Sunday December 21<sup>st</sup> at the Annual Cong. Meeting

\*The Session joyfully approved the reception of *Jack Katona* into active membership: "Welcome, Jack! We rejoice with you!"

\***Outreach** – Locally, we continue to provide weekend meals to students in our district (currently 23 students) – 2 distributions per month. Please continue to pray that God works through this ministry. Globally – we considered a request by missionary partners in Myanmar – upcoming collection for *MUST* Many of you know we have a partnership with the Myanmar Undergraduate School of Theology. Our friend and co-laborer (David Lian) just gave us an update (mid October). The Session discussed and prayed about the needs expressed. We certainly feel called to respond to our sisters and brothers in Christ. The decision was made – in light of many giving causes being promoted during the holidays (Nov. / Dec.) – to schedule and highlight the need starting in mid-January, so we can maximize our support and response for their ministry, facility, and student care. Please feel free to ask Matt, Pastor Brian, or an Elder if you have question – fuller details will come near the end of the year regarding the 4-week special offering in Jan.-Feb.

\*Puckety's **Deacons** helped a family with auto repair in October. They have put out the *Operation Christmas Child* shoeboxes (all boxes are to be returned *no later than Nov. 16th with the shipping amount enclosed* – responsibility of the "box-filler"). Please see the Thanksgiving Basket form elsewhere in this newsletter. Please also consider the other Samaritans Purse causes promoted by our Deacons – make your check payable to Puckety Presbyterian Church and put on the memo line the name of which project you are giving toward:

- The "Clean Water Project" (bring clean water to a community)
- The "Farm & Garden Project" (helping poor farming family to be sustainable)
- "New Missionary Doctor Project" (send desperately needed medical skills & expertise)

**YOUTH GROUP:** On September 12<sup>th</sup>, a dozen students and 6 adult leaders went to *Renshaw Farms Pumpkinfest*! We're so glad we didn't reschedule because the 19<sup>th</sup> was a washout! The kids had a blast at the various stations (corn pit, hay bale mountain, pumpkin canon, and more). There's a good chance that we'll go again! We had about 6 youth help with the Trunk or Treat + Bonfire - though a few got a little distracted - but everything was so fun it's hard to blame them! In our Bible Study time we have discussed the different ways to handle shame and guilt (hiding vs. confessing), and used videos to explore the parts of *The Lord's Prayer* so we see it as a pattern to follow, not just words to recite. We finished the month with our annual Halloween Party (extra thanks to Maria, Rodney, and Tyler Schafer for their help with it all!) We have a *Mall Scavenger Hunt* planned for November, and we're looking forward to the *Winter Weekend Retreat at Pine Springs* (Feb. 6-8). Though it's a couple months away, students (6<sup>th</sup> grade and up) need to let Pastor Brian know if they'd like to go no later than December 14<sup>th</sup> (discount based on attendance at regular youth meetings from Sept. 14 to Dec. 7th)











## Operation Christmas Child - What is Operation Christmas Child?

The Samaritan's Purse project **Operation Christmas Child** collects shoebox gifts filled with fun toys, school supplies and hygiene items—and delivers them to children in need around the world to demonstrate God's love in a tangible way. For many of these children, the gift-filled shoebox is the first gift they have ever received. Children receiving the shoebox are enrolled in 12-lesson discipleship program and given a booklet titled "The Greatest Journey" that will teach them how to follow Christ.

This year, Puckety Church will once again be sponsoring Operation Christmas Child. Starting October 19, 2025, through November 16, 2025, shoeboxes will be at all entrances to the sanctuary. Instructions on how to pack the shoebox and an age category label are included. Please bring your shoebox to Puckety Church by Sunday November 16, 2025.



Shipping cost is \$10.00 and ways to pay for shipping are included in the pamphlet. Shoeboxes will be delivered to the collection site at Grace Community Church starting Monday, November 17, 2025

### **Samaritan's Purse – 2025**

This year Puckety Church is participating through Samaritan's Purse to pursue reaching out internationally to provide the gift of hope to victims of war, disaster, poverty, and famine. This organization offers training, education, and humanitarian aid, as well as working with local churches and ministry partners for the purpose of teaching the gospel of Jesus Christ. This year, three categories are being presented to you, the congregation, to prayerfully consider a Samaritan's Purse gift donation to any of the categories listed below. Please read the descriptions.

#### **1. Bring Clean Water to a Community – A Clean Water Project**

To disaster-stricken areas – an emergency response – to provide clean water, sanitation such as latrines, and deliver water tanks.

To work with communities facing water scarcity, contaminated water.

Digging wells, installing filtering systems, training to maintain and repair the water system, teach health and hygiene education, proper food handling and waste disposal.

Spiritual outreach and support.

#### **2. Help a Poor Farming Family – A Farm and Garden Project**

Drought, infestation, and disaster can ruin a harvest. Samaritan's Purse will provide seeds, tools, fertilizer, drought resistant plants.

Teaching and training – to diversify crops, provide knowledge and valuable resources to grow their own food, develop sustainable gardening practices in a climate changing world.

Building a greenhouse, teach and train to find a source of water.

Spiritual Outreach and support.

#### **3. Send a New Missionary Doctor – New Missionary Doctor Project**

There is a desperate need for medical expertise in the developing world and remote hospitals. Doctors who have chosen to become missionary doctors enroll in a 2-year training course called Post-Residency Program. This is a fully funded program where doctors work alongside veteran missionary doctors to develop skills needed to practice medicine in developing countries overseas.

Process includes – Application and selection Training and preparation

Doctor and family serve in the mission field Option to enroll in another assignment

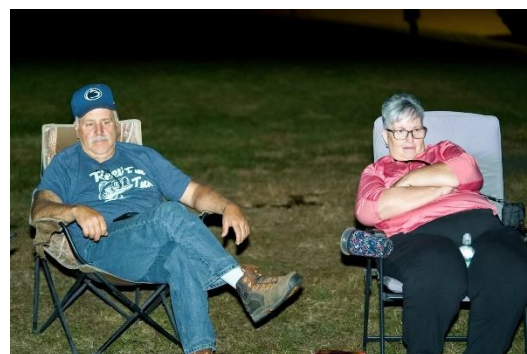
