Frequently asked questions about the program:

Does my child need to be attending the public preschool program in my town to be eligible?

"Your child can be attending preschool elsewhere"

Is my child eligible as soon as they turn four or are they eligible once the school year starts?

"Your child is eligible during the school year, they turn 4 by the Sept. 1st deadline. They are still eligible if they turn 5 during that school year. "

What types of support are provided by this program?

A Preschool Support Coordinator will meet with eligible four year olds and their families to find out what their needs are. These meetings can happen in the family's home or at another location where the family feels comfortable. ie: school, library, or workplace.



The Preschool Support Program provides

- beneficial screenings (hearing, vision, dental, health and developmental)
- connect to community resources for assistance like housing, food, etc.
- assistance with applications ie: child care financial assistance
- coordinate/pay for transportation from home to preschool or appointments
- mileage reimbursement for transportation to/from preschool and development/health screenings and/or appointments

Who is eligible for this program?

In order to be eligible for this program, a child must be four years old by September 1, of the current school year and living in Jamaica, Townshend or Wardsboro, VT. and meet the income guidelines,

*** Please note: These income guidelines are broader than free or reduced lunch. So, if your family qualifies for free and reduced lunch your family will automatically qualify.**
