In a recent interview, Samuel Eyo Umoren shared some information about his experience as a teacher at CELA (Christian Entrepreneur and Leadership Academy).

I teach the 6th Grade. Some of the subjects I teach include Mathematics, English, Social Studies, Literature, Agricultural Science,

Quantitative/Verbal Reasoning and Home economics. I have been teaching for about 8 years. I have taught in other schools before, but the experience



of teaching at CELA is completely different. CELA enables us to create an environment where learning thrives by providing basic educational aids for kids, food, and other opportunities. For example, our former students receive sponsorship/support in high school. It builds the hope and confidence of both pupils and teachers. The other schools where I have taught were profit driven. That is very different from what is happening at CELA. We have good parent-teacher relationships. And the appreciation shown for the hard work of both pupils and tutors makes it unique. My class size is usually around 24 pupils. The materials like textbooks that I use are those approved by the State. We still use chalkboards and have no functioning computer. Despite what we

lack, the environment is welcoming and promotes mutual benefits. The kids are so promising and committed regardless of their background.

When asked what their needs were, Samuel mentioned a need for play things; toys and games for students to use during their leisure time. He also mentioned a need for a bus, because of the difficulty that many students have traveling to and from classes. When the new building is completed, the staff looks forward to the provision of a dining hall where they will also hold assemblies. Mr. Umoren is just one of the many teachers who are making a difference in the lives of the children of Akwa Ibom State.

She also thought it was very interesting to see how other cultures live. She was quite surprised by what she saw. She explains, "maybe it was my naiveté, but I didn't expect to see such poverty on a continent as rich as Africa. I was changed in a way, because I was reminded not to dwell on the small stuff; to always remember to be thankful for what I have and those around me; to share as often as I can with whatever I have."
