Buying Metal Detectors in General.

There is no need to buy a brand new metal detector. Most metal detector shops have quality used metal detectors and the price can be considerable less than a similar new metal detector.

If you want a new metal detector, that's fine, but if you can't afford a new metal detector or your not sure of what brand and model you want, buying used is a solid choice. You may also be able to get more for your money buying used. And if it turns out that you made a poor choice, generally, you'll have less depreciation with a used model.

Have a reputable metal detector dealer check the metal detector you've decided on just as you would get a good mechanic to check out a use car.

Also check the metal detector stores return policy before buying a metal detector, this is a must do.

If you decide to buy a new detector, give me a call as I can get most brands and at very low prices for members. Russell
