### Anaheim Fire & Rescue

“A bystander providing basic lifesaving measures to a cardiac arrest victim extends the chances of survival immensely,” stated **Anaheim Fire Chief Randy R. Bruegman**. “Your lifesaver could be in the next aisle of a retail store or perhaps at the same restaurant. When alerted through PulsePoint, citizen CPR can be administered almost immediately.”

### Brea/Fullerton Fire Departments

“PulsePoint is a great partnership between first responders and community members trained in CPR,” said **Brea/Fullerton Fire Chief Wolfgang Knabe**. “Together we can make a difference.”

### Fountain Valley Fire Department

“By connecting CPR trained residents with the PulsePoint application, we become a stronger community in response to sudden cardiac arrest,” said **Fountain Valley Fire Chief Tony Coppolino**. “The assistance that is administered within minutes of an attack can make a major difference in one’s recovery.”

The impact that this program may have on someone’s life is invaluable”
