ALVELEY OLD CHAPEL

I am constantly being asked when we are going to extend the opening of the AOC Tea Room. My answer every time I am asked is "when I have sufficient volunteers".

We need to stop and think how many things run in our village as a result of people giving their time freely and what we would lose if nobody volunteered. Volunteering is extremely rewarding and it gives so much to the community for just a few hours of our time. A quote from John F Kennedy states *"Every person can make a difference, and every person should try."* Audrey Hepburn wrote *"As you grow older, you will discover that you have two hands — one for helping yourself, the other for helping others."* There are many such quotes from famous people who have given some of their time freely to make a difference.

Currently, the tea room is open on Tuesdays and Wednesdays from 11.00am to 3.00pm. Ultimately, we want to extend to opening on Thursdays and to extend the opening hours. The shifts at the moment for volunteers are 11.00am to 1.00pm and 1.00pm to 3.00pm with a requirement to start half

an hour earlier for setting up and staying after closing for clearing up. The menus are simple and the food is prepared fresh at the time of ordering. The atmosphere is friendly with plenty of laughter and banter amongst volunteers and customers alike.

The tea room offers people many things from being a meeting place for friends to meet, to giving comfort to people in their hour of need. I myself took comfort following the loss of my mother whom I looked after for many years. I found the tea room allowed me to relax with a cuppa in a friendly vibrant place rather than sitting at home alone in silence.

The Old Chapel is available to rent on an hourly basis for parties, functions and groups. The cost is £10.00 per hour with a requirement to provide your own refreshments. We can also offer some community projects the use of the Old Chapel free of charge depending on the benefit to the community.

To finish off, let me tempt you with our summer menu. We offer white and wholemeal rolls with fillings such as cheese, tuna mayo and freshly carved ham. These are served with a salad garnish and posh crisps. We also serve jacket potatoes with various fillings, homemade Quiche Lorraine and toasted sandwiches with a variety of fillings, all served with a salad garnish. To finish there is a wide selection of delicious homemade cakes and a wide range of hot and cold drinks. THE BIRMINGHAM 2022 QUEEN'S BATON RELAY

The Birmingham 2022 Queen's Baton Relay – the Commonwealth Games' equivalent of the Olympic Torch Relay – began on 7 October 2021, with Her Majesty The Queen placing her Message to the Commonwealth into the Baton. Its 294-day journey of approximately 90,000 miles (140,000 kilometres) visiting all 72 nations and territories taking part in the Games will be back in the West Midlands from 18th July for its final leg. The baton will be travelling on the SVR's 'purple loco', No. 70 'Elizabeth II' from Kidderminster to Bridgnorth on Saturday 23rd July. SEVERN VALLEY COUNTRY PARK

We would like to say an enormous THANK YOU to the Alveley Chapel Crafters for creating a most beautiful textile wall hanging of the park. We approached the Crafters in February to ask them if they would like to be part of a community project to help celebrate 30 years of Severn Valley Country Park. They worked alongside Highley WI and Georgia Jacobs from Abberley and Malvern Hills Geopark, who we would also like to say an enormous thank you to, and the end result is 3 wall hangings which are now on display in the visitor centre. Highley WI designed a wall hanging which depicts the park 320 million years ago during the Carboniferous period, when large trees and ferns dominated the area. Insects were enormous and the area was largely lakes and floodplains. The ladies have created a landscape you feel you can step into.

Georgia designed a hanging which shows the geology beneath our feet with the coal seams featured and images of the mine and aerial ropeways. With Georgia's passion for geology it's an accurate portrayal with a bit of textile flair!

The Alveley Chapel Crafters took on the challenge of the park as it is today. The design they came up with touches on all aspects of the park – the river, bridge, visitor centre, wildflower meadows, beehives, kingfishers, kestrels – the level of detail in the wall hanging is fantastic. The ladies have thought of every aspect of the park. See the photo of the wall hanging on page 16.

The time and effort put into all the wall hangings by the Crafters, Highley WI and Georgia has been so generous and the end results are beautiful. The hangings will be on display permanently at the park. We also have a textile exhibition in the visitor centre with works inspired by the park. These will be on display throughout the summer holidays as part of Geofest 2022. The hangings and exhibition are also in recognition of the 10th anniversary of the Abberley and Malvern Hills Geopark. Georgia Jacobs has worked with the park closely for around 6 years and her input and support with the wall hangings and exhibition has been invaluable.

June has been busy with school visits. For some of the children it has been their first ever school trip and even arriving by bus has been exciting for them! It has been great welcoming schools back to the park and our new ranger, Guy has been enjoying taking on the new challenge of school visits.

These had been placed there by the **'Field Studies Council'**, as a general guide for passers by, so helping them identify the many wild birds and flowers that you may come across on your walks.

This I thought was a great idea for those of us that wish to know more about the wildlife that you may be able to spot in the woods and along the edge.

When I got home I looked up the Field Studies Council, and as well as their excellent educational training programmes, they also publish over 80 laminated card packs, depicting everything from birds, bees and bugs, to wild flowers, in fact, all things fauna and flora.

These I believe would be a great asset to all that love the great outdoors, being able to identify all that surrounds us on our walks, especially younger ones. What better way to introduce them to the outdoors, than from an early age?

This I thought was a great idea for those of us that wish to know more about the wildlife that you may be able to spot in the woods and along the edge.

There's always something new to experience and learn on a walk. You could walk the same route a hundred times, and still come across, or hear something new, whether it be a different bird, a new bird song, animal track or wild flower. This is what makes walking in the countryside on our doorstep such a treat, not just giving you a feeling of inner contentment, but a connection with nature, both in body and mind.

ALL IN THE MONTH OF JULY

175 years ago, on 24th July 1847 Salt Lake City in Utah was founded by Mormon pioneers, led by Brigham Young.

150 years ago, on 1st July 1872 Louis Bleriot, French inventor, and aviation pioneer was born. He developed the first practical headlamp for cars and became the first person to fly across the English Channel.

125 years ago, on 21st July 1897 the Tate Britain art museum opened in London.

90 years ago, on 8th July 1932 the USA's stock market (Dow Jones Industrial Average) fell to its lowest point (41.22) during the Great Depression.

Also 90 years ago, on 19th July 1932 Lambeth Bridge in London was officially opened.

80 years ago, on 22nd July 1942 the Nazis began the mass transportation of Jews from the Warsaw Ghetto in Poland to the Treblinka extermination camp.

Also 80 years ago, on 31st July 1942 the British charity Oxfam was founded. (Oxford Committee for Famine Relief)

75 years ago, on 9th July 1947 Buckingham Palace announced the engagement of Princess Elizabeth (later Queen Elizabeth II) to Lieutenant Philip Mountbatten.

65 years ago, on 6th July 1957 John Lennon and Paul McCartney met for the first time at a church hall in Liverpool, where 16-year-old Lennon was performing with his skiffle group the Quarrymen. 15-year-old McCartney joined as a rhythm guitarist shortly afterwards, and the pair went on to form the Beatles.

60 years ago, on 10th July 1962 Swedish engineer Nils Bohlin was granted a US patent for the three-point safety belt for vehicles. It is now used in practically all road vehicles.

40 years ago, on 9th July 1982 Michael Fagan broke into Buckingham Palace and spent 10 minutes talking to the Queen in her bedroom.

15 years ago, on 1st July 2007 smoking was banned in all enclosed workspaces in England.

ROYAL BRITISH LEGION POPPY TREK TO ENGLAND'S HIGHEST WAR MEMORIAL

The Royal British Legion is encouraging people to sign up for this year's Poppy Trek events taking place on the 13th and 14th of August, to raise vital funds for service personnel, veterans and their families.

Fundraisers will have the opportunity to hike one of two iconic routes – a 9mile trek to England's highest war memorial at the summit of Scafell Pike, or a 6-mile trek to Great Gable, its beautiful neighbouring mountain and a brand-new route for 2022.

Both the 9-mile and 6-mile routes will take participants through the picturesque and unique landscapes of the Lake District before reaching the 963metre or 886-metre peak. After stopping to take in the views across Cumbria, participants will share a moment of reflection in a minute's silence, paying tribute to the sacrifices made by our Armed Forces community past and present.

Scafell Pike was part of 'The Great Gift', where several Cumbrian peaks were gifted to the National Trust, a generous act which was made at the end of the First World War. Great Gable also holds special significance with a dedicatory war memorial commemorated at the summit, in recognition of the members of The Fell & Rock-Climbing Club who fought in The First World War.

The money raised from Poppy Trek goes towards supporting people like Afghanistan veteran Mike Kiff, who was discharged from the Army due to chronic pain and depression. When Mike and his wife discovered they could get support from the RBL, their lives changed.

Poppy Trek is a fantastic way for people to show their support for the Royal British Legion and have some fun at the same time. Everyone taking part will be raising vital funds for service personnel, veterans and their families who are struggling through hardships, injuries, and bereavements.

The Scafell Pike hike takes place on the Saturday 13th August, and Great Gable on Sunday 14th. Entry for both routes is £30 and includes an exclusive Poppy Trek medal.


