HOA Yard of the Month for December

The committee had a difficult time choosing the winner of yard of the month for December for best decorated holiday yard, as there were so many wonderful yards to choose from! Styles ranged from homes with inflatables, to homes with traditional single-bulb lights, to those with the new laser lights that project stationary or moving patterns on the entire side of a house, including the second story, which is difficult to illuminate using traditional strands of lights, and all combinations. The winner selected was 2324 Creekside Drive (on the northeast corner with Eagleview Circle), belonging to Virginia and Dave Garrison. Their traditional-looking single strand red and green roofline lights were hung on the second as well as first floor, a large illuminated wreath was hung under the gable, and illuminated candy canes appeared in the four front second story windows. Festive red and white swags of lights continued the candy cane theme along the split rail fence on the south side of the house. Neighbors to the east have the same lights on their split rail fences for continuity. Virginia says that they've been doing their Christmas lights for 10-15 years, with the window lights a more recent addition. Although there is only one "winner" for December, the committee felt that 2532 Eagleview Circle deserved honorable mention for the perfectly illuminated giant evergreen in their back yard, visible from the street on the right (north) of the house.
