Searching for Summer Sniff and Go



WWCDTC's first Sniff and Go was so successful that we will host another. Our *Searching for Summer Sniff and Go* will be held on Saturday, June 1. Our last event was limited to Container and Interior searches. The upcoming event will focus on Handler Discrimination, Buried, Vehicle, Exterior, and Interior searches. All the searches will be at the *Novice* level except for one *Advanced* Exterior search and an *Excellent* Interior search. Here's a little more information about the searches.

Handler Discrimination

In addition to the 4 AKC elements (Containers, Interiors, Exteriors, and Buried), Handler Discrimination is another, but <u>separate</u> class of Scent trials. It has its own set of titles. Currently Handler Discrimination is not part of any of the AKC Scent Work titles. But, that <u>might</u> change sometime in the future.

For **Novice** Handler Discrimination, you need to provide a cotton sock or a cotton glove that contains your scent. How to scent your article? This is what the AKC recommends:

"Handlers may utilize any method that they wish to scent the article. Suggestions include rubbing the article on the handler's body or storing the article in dirty laundry."

Your scented item has the odor used in Handler Discrimination. The search will have ten containers with one hide to find. However, there will be 2 scents—yours and the judge's. No points are given if your dog alerts on the judge's sock!



If you plan to do the Handler Discrimination searches:

Remember to bring a scented item that you will place in a zippered plastic bag before handing to the judge.

Buried Searches

At the *Novice* level, there is one hide (Birch) which is buried 2 inches deep in a plastic container filled with play sand. At the *Novice* level there are a total of 6 containers to search. (Notice of AKC rule change: As of October 1, 2019, all classes of buried will have hides buried 4 inches deep. Novice will still be buried in play sand, but Advanced will be buried in water!)

Exterior Searches

An Exterior search is a lot like an interior search but is a little more challenging. The outdoor environment is more unpredictable. There may be wind, more temperature differences and humidity. There can be rain or snow. At our Sniff and Go—just like at a trial—the Exterior (and Vehicle) searches are done *rain or shine*. Actually, the only weather that stops the Exterior searches is lightning storms.

At the **Novice** level, there will be one accessible Birch hide. It will not be any higher than 2 feet off the ground. There will be no intentional distractions.

The *Advanced* Exterior search will have two hides that can be Birch and/or Anise. They can be no higher than 3 feet and will be accessible. There will be one non-food distraction (like a toy.) Currently handlers must call "Finish" *after* your dog finds the second hide and after you call the second "Alert." (Notice of AKC rule change: As of October 1, 2019 Failure to call "Finish" in a search with a known number of hides will be a *fault* plus maximum time, <u>not an NQ.</u>

Remember: If you plan to participate in the exterior searches, do dress for the weather conditions.

Vehicle Search

AKC Scent Work does not contain Vehicle Searches. However, Vehicles are included in *other* Scent Work venues including UKC and the National Association of Canine Scent Work—NACSW. Only the exterior of the vehicle is searched. Teams can receive faults if the dog excessively paws or damages the vehicle. As safety for the dogs is a prime consideration, you can also receive a fault if you let your dog crawl under the vehicle. Hides are often in the wheel well or the license plate. While searching do pay attention to wind direction.

At the NACSW *Novice* level there is one hide (Birch). There can be up to three vehicles (which can include motorcycles, cars, trucks, buses, trailers, semis and almost anything that has wheels.)

Interior Search

The Interior search at the *Excellent* level has 2 search areas. There are 3 hides between the 2 search areas. One area has one hide and the other area has 2 hides. In a trial, you won't know which area has 1 and which area has 2—that's what makes it interesting. You have to read your dog to figure out when he has found all the hides in that area. You will need to call "Finish" when your dog is done searching <u>each</u> search area. Each search area will be timed separately.

At the *Excellent* level any combination of Birch, Anise and/or Clove can be used. The hides should not be more than 4 feet high and there may be one inaccessible hide (i.e. where your dog cannot get close enough to put his nose on the hide). There will be two distractions. The distractions may be food, a toy, a sound (like a cell phone ringing), or visual.

The Sniff and Go is an inexpensive way to get trial experience and expert coaching. All skill levels welcome. The sign-up sheet is on the front table. Participants, Spectators and Volunteers are welcome!
