

Is God calling you to attend Daily Mass this Lent?





I want to personally invite you to consider attending a daily Mass sometime this Lenten season! We all know that many people who work during the day can't often attend daily Mass, however, we do have a 6:30 pm Mass on Wednesday evenings and a 9:00 pm Mass on Monday evenings if that possibly works for your schedule. A daily Mass does not substitute for the Sunday obligation, but instead, it is such a powerful opportunity to receive Christ in the Eucharist, pray for the world, and be nourished and worship God in the midst of your normal day-to-day activities and responsibilities. Usually, a daily Mass only lasts around 30 minutes long. It is a great way to start the day OR end the day as well! Please consider attending a daily Mass this Lenten season if you can, and let's continue to pray for each other so that our Lent may be transformative for our parish, our families, our community, our Diocese, the Catholic Church, and the entire world.


Orders forms are in the lobby of the church and must be received at the parish by Friday, April 25, 2025. Parishes will receive tickets on or before the week of May 19, 2025.








The Word of God Alive:

Discussing the Readings with your children.



Today is the first Sunday of Lent. What do you know about Lent? What is missing from the Mass during Lent?*

Lent is a time for us to focus on strengthening our relationship with God. We strive to make God the center of our lives. Growing closer to God involves prayer, fasting and almsgiving.

What is prayer?

Prayer is talking and listening to God. When we spend with God in prayer, we grow closer to God.

How might you pray and spend more time with God?

You can take time first thing in the morning thanking God for another day and asking him to make you a happy and giving person today. Pray before meals. Pray for all the people God has put in your life today. At bedtime pray for those who are sick, in need or have no place to live.

Fasting is giving something up in order to focus your attention on God. For example: if you give up soda, every time you want a soda, remind yourself to focus on God and his love for you.

Giving alms is an act of charity or love that helps someone in need. It's not just giving money or things but also giving our time and talents.

Living our Faith: Each day during lent pray to God, fast from something you like and do something nice and kind for others so you can grow closer to God.


