"SACRED SPACES"

The BGCVA (Baptist General Convention of Virginia) SACRED SPACES (Preservation of African American churches, cemeteries, Historic Structures, associated land and Landmarks) initiative enables the Baptist General Convention of Virginia (BGCVA) to provide training for new and current Church Historians. These historians (new and experienced) will learn and share research strategies, documentation methods and how to archive and preserve the historical documents related to the church, cemetery, school, and/or historical artifacts associated with the church. BGCVA provides at least four (4) training sessions per year via online seminars and additional classes during our various conferences and Annual Session.

• The key component to the success of this initiative involves documenting and archiving the history of BGCVA, our Associations and individual churches and their contributions to their communities as well to other significant occurrences (education, desegregation, Civil Rights, etc.) BGCVA will create a digital archive for historical documents, oral histories, books, and media documenting our rich history since 1899. This archive would

also include data and documents (special occasions, association meetings, etc.) received from our churches over the years.



 A primary outcome for this initiative will be the creation of digital archive of the history of BGCVA and the churches participating in the project. This project also includes assisting churches with researching and documenting other properties including cemeteries and other

- structures that could possibly be recognized for their historical significance.
- Churches that currently maintain their own archives and artifacts would continue to do so but participating churches would have the option of having a digital archive accessible online).

We would love to digitize your church and/ or association history, Sunday Union, or other church-related organization. obedience. Overwhelm them with appreciation and love!"





AN INTERVIEW WITH DR. VELEKA GATLING, THE DIRECTOR OF DIVERSITY INITIATIVES AT OLD DOMINION UNIVERSITY

Dr. Veleka Gatling, the Director of Diversity Initiatives at Old Dominion University

(ODU), is a woman who is well-versed in the field of education and a devout Christian. Born on October 17, 1971, in Norfolk Virginia to Carolyn and Leo Williams, she

lived an average childhood, but she went on to achieve many extraordinary feats in the field of education.

She started out her career in education by pursuing higher learning, attending James Madison University (93'), Old Dominion University (96'), and finally Virginia Tech (09'), ultimately resulting in a doctorate. These ventures into educa-

tion did not happen consecutively, however, and were punctuated by Dr. Gatling's pursuit in public education. Entering the field of education as a 2nd grade teacher, she worked her way up the ladder over the years, becoming a teacher for social studies, then a principal. During this time, she went

into the private education sector for the time that she was raising her then young son but returned to the public field not much later. In total she spent 25 years as a public-school worker.

Her husband, the Reverend Perez Gatling, became pastor of Ebenezer Baptist Church, elevating Dr. Veleka Gatling to the position of first lady. As won-

derful as it was to be so involved in ministry, balancing her responsibilities of both the regular job and first lady was a difficult act to perfect. But she knew in her heart that she "trusted God", and just when the troubles became too much to bear, ODU reached out to her. They offered her a position at the school, and once she accepted, her work-life balance was much more manageable.

Dr. Veleka Gatling first became a lecturer at ODU. She taught courses for aspiring administrators, much like she was back in her public education days, and as happy as she was to continue doing what she did, she was approached yet again. This time, she would become the Director of Diversity Initiatives and Assistant Vice President for Diversity. The job entails that she "provides diversity equity, fight microaggressions, and have conversations" so that total inclusion may be accomplished. And at a PWI (Predominantly White Institution), her role is incredibly necessary.



Needless to say, she did her job well and went above and beyond. Dr. Gatling helped people to think differently about diversity and to have discussions beyond what they learned. Afterall, reflection is a key part of comprehension. Additionally, she wants to transcend from

> mere diversity to inclusion. What's the difference? You can have a group of people, but all of them won't feel like they belong with just diversity. So, what does inclusion look like? opportunities, being heard in all spaces, and generally having the same experience regardless of your background.



Co-author of "An inexcusable Absence: The

Shortage of Black Male Teachers", Dr. Gat-

ling provided an excellent example of why inclusion is so important.

Growing up, Veleka Gatling only had one black male teacher. In a field that is fe-

male-



dominated, she felt compelled to write this book to bring awareness, give advice on how to fix the shortage, and to dispel myths about the black male. According to her, seeing a black male teacher so young introduced her to the concept of an educated black male, and that example left an imprint on her life.

If you were to ask Dr. Gatling what inspired her to reach the position that she is at currently, she would say her father. Back when her father was attending college, black peo-



ple were not allowed on campus, hindering his pursuit of education. Seeing his commitment to learning, she aspired to do what he could not: earn a doctorate. And that she did, but the main take away from this is that she also knows first-hand the necessity of inclusion, and what can be done once it's in place.

"Run your own race" is Dr. Veleka Gatling's message to students. Don't worry about your competitors and instead focus on your own path. Lots of things will try to pull your attention, but you will make it in the end. There are "infinite opportunities" and you will always walk into new experiences that will help you learn and grow. "We're not perfect," said Dr. Gatling, but with her ambition as Director of Diversity Initiatives, we're getting closer every day.

Helpful Steps Before the Storm:

- Put together an emergency prep kit that includes:
 - * Batteries and flashlights/lanterns
 - * Bottle water (1 gallon per person, per day)
 - * Cash (power outages could affect ATM machines)
 - * Non-perishable foods
 - * First aid kit, medications and hygiene items
 - * Vehicle phone charger
- Individuals with portable generators should purchase adequate fuel and review the product's safety instructions before operation.
- Develop an evacuation plan and implement it when it becomes necessary. Be sure to let your church leader, a trusted family member or friend know if you choose to leave or stay.
- Be sure to stay tuned to local weather updates in your area via television or battery-operated radio.
- Update your contact information with Dominion Energy, including a mobile phone number.
- Bookmark this website, <u>DominionEnergy.com</u>, on your computer or mobile device to quickly report outages.
- Download the <u>Dominion Energy app</u> and set up an account to easily report and track power outages.


