Some of the things teachers love to see and hear every day at school are smiling faces and happy voices. They also like to see children ready to learn. How can you help prepare your child for a day like this...

One way is to practice some of the behaviors below at home:

- **Picking up behind themselves** – Help them learn responsibility by encouraging them to keep their own spaces neat. Ask them to pick up their own toys and belongings and put them away. It will help with organization when they start school.
- **Sharing** – Keep playthings on hand that encourage sharing between children and individuals. Examples: board games, crayons, paint, and books. Sharing with siblings or friends at home can teach your child to share supplies, books, and playground equipment with classmates while at school.
- **Being patient** – When your child quietly sits at the doctor's office or stands in line at the store, point out their good behavior and talk about how important it is to be patient. "Thank you for being so patient. You did a really good job standing here quietly and allowing others to take the time to finish what they are doing. Great job!"
- **Sticking with it** – Boost your child's confidence with encouraging comments and suggestions. Example: say, "I know you can do it," or "Let's solve this problem together." Learning determination will help your child tackle new challenges and lessen frustration while at school.
