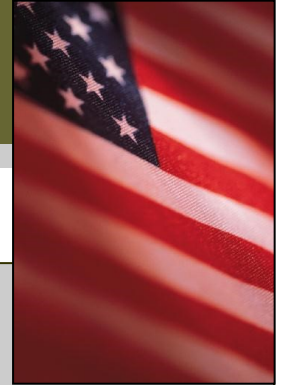

Great Notes From Our Point Leaders:

Here is a little update on my group. We have really appreciated the support we have received so far. My group is doing well and staying busy. All of the snacks have really helped get through long days and helps keep the guys energy up. Our PX store here is still very limited. As well as all of the good snack stuff that everyone has been sending a few other things that we are running out of and having a hard time getting are small safety equipment items like ear plugs, and work gloves. Since we do construction we go through these items like crazy. Again thank you to everyone that has been and will continue to send to support us. We really appreciate everything. — M Ciesielski

I am a Specialist and have been active in the Army for 3 years. I am currently deployed in Kuwait in a location called Camp Arifjan. The conditions are rather stable and peaceful. I would say the biggest issue is the heat and lack of products in the exchange/PX here on post. Deodorant is definitely something we could use and a variety of snacks too; we have 24 hour shifts and it gets boring, so eating snacks helps pass the time in my opinion. We have a microwave so popcorn is always an option. Thank you all for the assistance! — F Carter

Living conditions are fair. We are living in warehouses on cots (no A/C-heat). Electricity is run by city off/on 220-240V and goes out often and for extended periods of time. We need: protein, beef jerky, protein bars, almonds, nuts. There is one microwave on base and in makeshift DFAC. I am representing the entire base as their chaplain. — James Burke

We are currently a deployed hospital in Kuwait. Soldiers from all over the United States. We find ourselves much like the rest of the world locked in with no venue for entertainment. Being locked in base behind razor wire is especially difficult with no car or any entertainment since everything is closed. I am not certain whether this is the right venue or not but the Soldiers would certainly appreciate something to lift morale. — H Teplicki

We live in CHUs. We have small fridges, microwaves and water kettles. We have a self service laundry point, but we do not have the ability to do our own. We have a small trailer PX with limited items. I represent an Army detachment. We have female Soldiers and basic hygiene items are limited for everyone. — M Madden
