Pickaway Senior Center celebrated its 50th Anniversary during the Annual Fundraiser Friday, April 28, 2023. On Monday, as money was tallied and staff and seniors were sharing memories of the evening, a package from the Ohio Senate arrived. On Friday, April 28, the Center was closed for all regular meals and other services to allow time for the building to be prepared for the Annual Fundraiser. We'd begun the work of setting up the evening before, with the entire dining room reconfigured and set up to accommodate almost 200 people as well as space for Pritchard Auctioneering and display of live auction items, the piano with nearby seating for Georgia Shepherd and family, and our master of ceremonies and musician for the evening, Paul Blankenship. For a staff of less than 25, with most of us over the age of 50, it was a labor of love, Advil, and ice packs. In addition to moving all the supplies for Home Delivered Meals to the shed, all the seating in the library was moved into adult day rooms.

The library became the primary display area for silent auction items. With more than 100 items donated (see p5), some difficult decisions were made about how to package items to encourage bidding and not overwhelm the space we had to display the items. We settled on 47 silent, 15 live, and 10 raffle items for a more manageable 74 items. This part of the set up and documentation took five people just over 6 hours to complete and it looked fabulous!



Kitchen staff had begun its work months prior to the event, planning the menu, verifying availability of items, and ordering food and other supplies. By the day before the event, all deliveries were received, tables covered, chairs uncovered and moved into place, flatware hand polished, plates and serving ware clean and shiny, placemats and serving pieces placed with care, and the beef roasted.

The day of the event was a flurry of activity beginning at 1pm with fresh veggies prep for spring salad, then plating both salad and dessert — an apple blossom tart that received rave reviews!

Just as that work was completed, the volunteers arrived — including Belva Pritchard, Kathleen Lloyd, Julianne Temple, Marilyn Fausnaugh, Naomi Adkins, Penny Fick, Jeane Crider, Connie Walker, Deb Schooley, Diana Rhymer, Manan Wertman, Stevie Parker, Karen Stockham, Marian Garner, Glenda Manson, Steve Kempton, Pat Acord, Capi Picklesimer, and Kathy Maxon — who began their work, placing drinking glasses, salads, and desserts at each setting. As staff and volunteers completed portions of their assigned tasks, they were able to enjoy dinner together in the adult day area.



Guests began to arrive, check in, choose a seat, then browse the silent and live auction items, as well as raffle items and baked goods available for purchase. Silent auction bidding began immediately with some early one-upmanship making for good natured ribbing. It was great to see folks having a great time right off the bat!

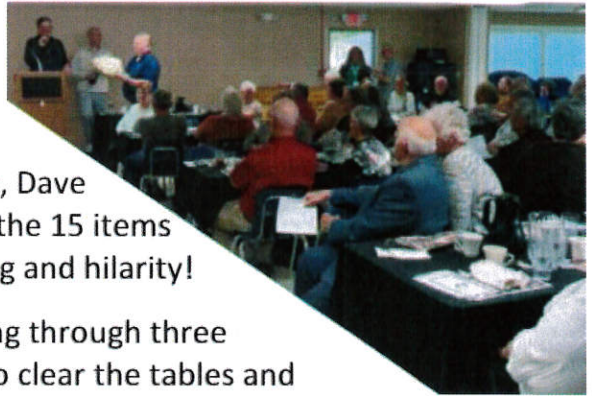
Then Executive Director, Holly Romine, called us into the dining room, Ellery Elick offered prayer, and dinner service began in a flurry of focused activity! As diners finished their meal, they circulated back into the silent auction area to renew their primary bidding position and shop the remaining baked goods.

Throughout dinner, we were kept on track and entertained by Paul Blankenship. As plates were cleared, the silent auction was closed and the live auction kicked off!

Pickaway finest elected officials worked with our auctioneer, Dave Pritchard, to stimulate interest and ever-increasing bids for the 15 items available for bidding. There was a lot of good natured ribbing and hilarity!

The evening ended and winners gathered their items, moving through three checkout stations steadily. The volunteers and staff began to clear the tables and return things to their usual places to ensure a smooth start on Monday morning, when staff, once again, rolls in starting at 5:30 am.

Each day, our kitchen and home meal delivery staff gather to feed just over 400 people. The Annual Fundraiser is only different in the number of meals, room layout, and a bit more formal feeling. It is amazing to watch our team come together to feed people in a variety of ways, and do it with such heart and attention.



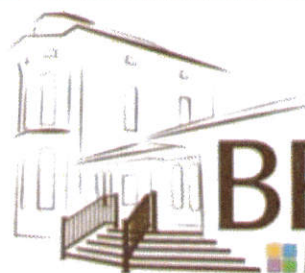
