# The Wonderful Cross: A Symbol of Shame Turned to Glory

APRIL 2025

The cross. A brutal instrument of torture, humiliation, and death. In the Roman world, it was reserved for the worst criminals—a public display of shame meant to strike fear into the hearts of all who saw it. Yet, for us as believers, the cross is not a symbol of disgrace but of hope, love, and redemption. How could something so terrible become something so wonderful?

The Apostle Paul puts it plainly in 1 Corinthians 1:18: "For the message of the cross is foolishness to those who are perishing, but to us who are being saved it is the power of God." What the world saw as weakness, God transformed into the greatest victory of all time—the defeat of sin and death through Jesus Christ.

This transformation is reflected in some of the most cherished hymns of our faith. "The Old Rugged Cross" speaks of the shame of the cross but also the believer's devotion to it: "I will cling to the old rugged cross and exchange it someday for a crown." Isaac Watts' classic hymn "When I Survey the Wondrous Cross" invites us to marvel at the love poured out there: "Love so amazing, so divine, demands my soul, my life, my all." And Chris Tomlin's "The Wonderful Cross" echoes this truth, declaring, "Oh, the wonderful cross, bids me come and die and find that I may truly live."

The beauty of the cross is that what the world saw as defeat, God used for His greatest triumph. Jesus endured the cross *"for the joy set before Him"* (Hebrews 12:2) — that joy being our redemption and reconciliation to God. The shame was real, but it was swallowed up in victory.

Historically, the early Christians did not use the cross as a symbol right away. It was too closely associated with suffering and death. But as they came to understand Christ's victory over the grave, the cross transformed in their eyes. By the fourth century, after Emperor Constantine outlawed crucifixion, the cross had become a central image of Christian faith. Scholar N.T. Wright affirms this shift, noting, "Jesus' death was seen not as a tragic end but as the foundation of a new beginning—the new creation that God was bringing into the world through Him."

As we prepare to celebrate Easter, we invite you to reflect on the wonder of the cross and the hope it brings. Join us on April 20th as we rejoice in Christ's resurrection:

- 7:00 AM Sunrise Service: Awake the day to see HE IS RISEN
- 8:00 AM Breakfast: Enjoy fellowship over a delicious meal.
- 9:00 AM Easter Egg Hunt: A fun-filled activity for the kids.
- 10:00 AM Praise Service: Lift your voices in worship as we celebrate our Risen Savior!

This Easter, may we once again stand in awe of the wonderful cross—the place where shame was turned into glory, death into life, and sorrow into everlasting joy.




