Treasurer update on funds spent this year:

Quaeley trail improvements \$29,952.05

Divide trail clearing \$16,536.00

Groomer repairs \$27,720.11 (\$4540.47 this summer)

Insurance costs \$1,975.00

Waiting on final 40% grant funds for trail work from CSA

Groomer operational grant is the same as last year, with the split being 60% to the snow club and 40% to the state parks for wages and fuel. This should allow the club to build up cash reserves for future groomer replacement.

Larry and Bob cleared 42 road this September after the wind event over Labor Day. Thanks for making the road passable with an eye on snow cat width requirements.

For membership renewal please use the website. It is much improved over last year. We have included the trail map on the site for ease of use.

Ryan Crabb from the State Parks has the new signs ready to install to direct snowmobile trailers to the Marina parking lot; this will alleviate the bottle neck up in Columbine with trailer parking.

Larry and Mark did the snow cat service in house this summer, thank you for your awesome work on this. They replaced the alternator, installed new lights and wiper relay. Heater is functioning. Changed fluids and filters.

Snow Cat will need an "A" service next summer, a much more involved level of service.
