History of Florida's Ques on the Hill

Ques on the Hill was first hosted by Omega's Florida Statewide Organization in 2003.

The Vision of Senators Tony Hill & Gary Siplin, Representatives Tee Holloway & Frank Peterman, Jr. and Congressman Kendrick Meek, combined with the charge of 37th Grand Basileus, the Honorable George H. Grace and 18th Seventh District Representative Edgar L. Mathis, led to the creation of the first Omega Day at Capitol Hill. They wanted a day for Brothers to visit the State Capitol, learn about the legislative process and return home with civic knowledge to share.

Experienced with State & Federal Policy, Brother Sam Oliver became the Chairman for the occasion, with capable Co-Chair Brother Terrell Jenkins. Connecting the dots between the Brothers in the State House & Senate at the time, and leveraging their influence and resources, they architected an impactful and educational Day on the Hill that broke ground for Omega, immediately dawning the nickname "Ques on the Hill."

Omega Psi Phi Fraternity was the FIRST NPHC Fraternity in the state to host a Day at the Capitol, paving the way for all Divine Nine frats to follow suit. It ran like a smooth train for a decade, masterfully oiled by Conductor Brother Oliver, with rising fraternity leaders like Brother Benjamin Crump, E. Newton Jackosn, Jr., and Darron Toston working alongside. Crafting themes annually and inviting Brothers from across the state & nation to participate, Ques on the Hill became a signature event for the Florida Statewide Organization (FSO)

After 2012, Omega was down to one (1) Brother left in the State Legislature: Brother Darryl Rouson of St. Petersburg serving in the State House. Soon after, Chairman Oliver ascended to other professional roles, taking his hands off the Ques on the Hill steering wheel for the first time since its inception. There was not another Omega to join Rep Rouson in the State House until 2015; by then resources dwindled and our day at the capitol came to a slow halt.

In 2019, 23rd FSO State Representative M. Kevin Woodall gave the charge to reestablish a Ques on the Hill, only to be thwarted by the pandemic. In 2022, 24th State Representative Darron Toston gave a similar charge, leading to a Virtual Ques on the Hill. In 2023 Omega returned to an in-person Ques on the Hill for the first time in a decade: led by Chair Russell Drake and VREM Committee Chairs J. Randy Johnson and Manuel Jones and anchored by Ques on the Hill Chair Emeritus Sam Oliver. Subsequently a bountiful Ques on the Hill occurred in 2024. Persevering through years of pain to days of joy, Senator Darryl Rouson is again our fraternity's lone representation in the State Legislature.

Omega is Back in Tallahassee for Ques on the Hill 2025 – Chaired by Russell Drake with Co-Chairs Terrell Jenkins, Randy Johnson, Sam Oliver and Frank Peterman, III. Organized by a 25-man committee, Omega has Cemented our Return to the Hill, with a timely theme of "Silence is Not an Option. Our Work Continues".



FL Civil Right Hall of Fame Status and Petition

In 2010, The Florida Legislature (CS/HB 523) established the Florida Civil Rights Hall of Fame to recognize and honor individuals who have made significant contributions as leaders for equality & justice in human and civil rights. Under the law, the Florida Commission on Human Relations recommends 10 people to the Governor, who selects up to three inductees. To be considered, nominees must have been born in Florida or have adopted Florida as their home state or base of operation.

FL Civil Rights Hall of Fame is located at the Florida State Capitol Building on the Plaza Level southeast corner of the Rotunda. Each inductee has a permanent plaque with an appended photograph and biography in tribute to their works. The first class was nominated in 2011 and inducted in February 2012. Classes were nominated and inducted annually until 2019.
