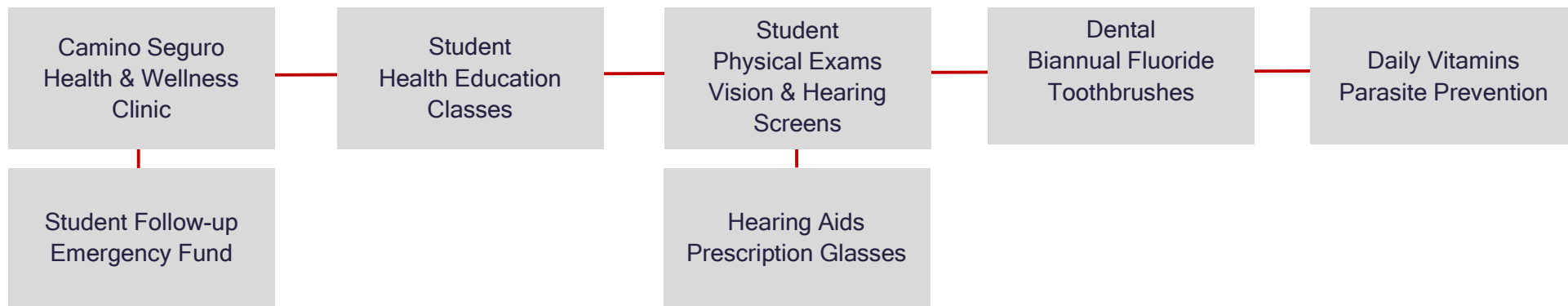
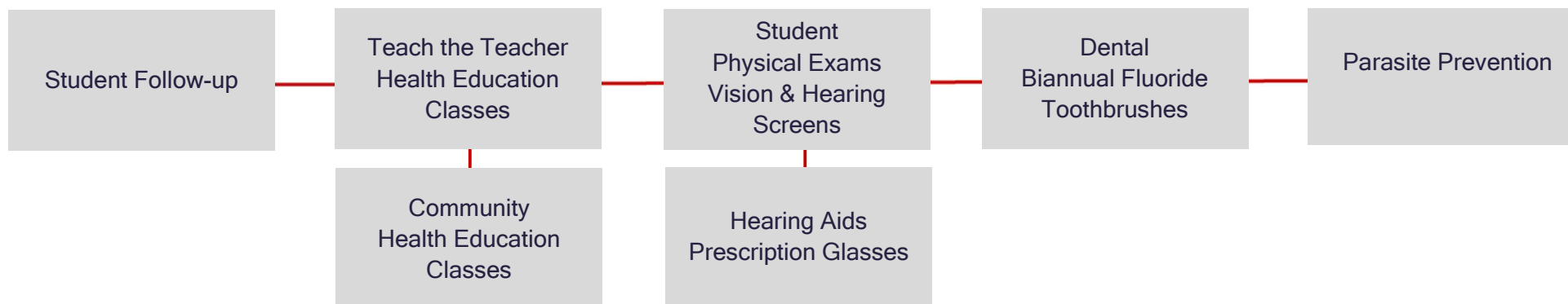

PREVENTIVE HEALTH

Participants in the Shared Beat Preventive Health Program are from 7 schools. The program includes:

Annual Checkups and Follow-up

The annual physical gives the doctor a chance to give the child a thorough physical exam and address issues before they become problems. All students requiring further tests or treatment are followed by the Shared Beat school health coordinators.

Vision Screening

When children cannot see clearly, they cannot learn clearly. Often this can be fixed with a simple pair of prescription glasses. Children are screened and if needed, provided glasses by a local Optometrist. Our all-star Vision Program Director is Mark Bisett.

Hearing Screening

Hearing loss affects learning and development of speech and interpersonal skills in children. Recognizing the unmet need for hearing health, Shared Beat began offering hearing screening two years ago. Dental

Good health requires good oral health. Bi-annually, students receive fluoride treatments and new toothbrushes. Thank you to the Joan H.
