From the Pastor's Desk...

"Return to the Lord your God, for he is gracious and merciful. Slow to anger and abounding in steadfast love and abounding in steadfast love." (Joel 2:13) This is one of the Gospel Acclamations (ELW, pg. 142) that may be used during the season of Lent, it's one that I have sung many times over the years. Even though we are not currently in the season of Lent, these words have been running through my mind more and more these days.

We, as a congregation and in many places throughout the world, are in a season of "returning" to familiar places and practices. With many peoples' lives being interrupted over the last year and a half, some in tragic ways, this season of "returning" has been anticipated for some time now. A "return" to being able to go about our pre-pandemic daily lives, of being able to confidently gather with family and friends, of feeling less restricted, etc... At the church, we have returned to indoor in-person worship for a few months now and as health guidelines have recently been adjusted, we are "returning" to some familiar practices at the church as well. We are being intentionally cautious in how and what we "return" to as far as some practices for worship and fellowship go.

While we are "returning" to practices in our lives, may we be reassured that while the scripture verse from Joel says "return to the Lord your God", we have never been alone...God has not forsaken us. And may we also be fully aware that physically "returning" to church is not the only way to "return to the Lord your God". If we have learned anything about our faith in God during the pandemic, it is to expand our thinking of who God is...when we had to abruptly halt gathering in-person worship and fellowship, we trusted that God wasn't present only in the physical building of Bethlehem Lutheran, that God was present in our homes and in all other areas of our lives. God is present where God's people are present...so "returning to the Lord" isn't only about returning to the physical building of BLC. We want to be a community of welcome, for those who physically come to the church and those who participate with the church online. While we continue to experience more "returns" to the familiar, may we be assured that returning to the Lord our God is one of blessing, in knowing that there is One who is already with us.
