- To build self confidence and leadership skills.



The Port of Arlington's mission is to support the creation, retention, expansion, and recruitment of businesses and jobs that will enhance the economy and quality of life of Gilliam County.


Administration

Tyler Bufton completed his job as part of Port's summer maintenance crew. Tyler did a great job for the Port completing numerous projects. We wish him well with his studies this fall.

Railroad Avenue

Watco's new Deport building is complete! The company is moving into their new facilitates this month. The company has successfully renegotiated a new contract with Union Pacific. They will continue on as the Condon spur short line rail operator.

Watco is a wonderful community company. They have utilized local talent to design and build this beautiful office complex in the style of a railroad depot. The Port assisted with facilitating the project. Watco welcome to your new facilities.



Watco moves the railcars from the Arlington siding to the Waste Management Rail yard and back. Engineering and site work were performed by Jeff Schott, Pillar Consulting of Condon. The building design was by Vernon Grey, Vernon Grey Designs of Condon. The facilities were constructed by China Creek Contractors of Arlington. This was an all local team project facilitated by the Port of Arlington.

Economic Development

The Port is assisting a potential flex building tenant obtain a conditional use permit. The application will need to be submitted to the Arlington Planning Commission for approval. The project could provide at least 6 new jobs to the community.

Island Park

The Port's emphasis on developing plans to expand infrastructure to Island Park is paying off. As a result of these conceptual expansion plans and excellent water front location, a light industrial tenant prospect has expressed interest in locating their firm's manufacturing facility in Arlington. More details will follow as project development costs become available.

RV and Marina

The Port was awarded a \$278,751.06 grant from the Oregon State Marine Board for the Bathroom replacement and Parking lot improvement project contingent upon the Port increasing its' match amount by \$75,000 for a total of \$226,893.26. The new restroom with showers will serve the cruising boaters, RV and marina users, wind surfer/kite boarders, walkers and boat ramp users. Updating the parking area to meet current design standards will improve boater experience. Separating nonmotorized boating use from the launch ramp and designating gravel single car parking will encourage use by kayakers and stand up paddleboarders.







NEED

The Port of Arlington has a concrete boat ramp, flush restroom, paved parking area, short term tie-up dock, marine fuel station, pumpout and port-a-potty dump station, marina, RV Park, wind surfing access and trail. The facility serves a variety of boating activities such as fishing, watersports, sailing, cruising, personal watercraft, nonmotorized boating and windsurfing/kiteboarding. Fishing for walleye and smallmouth bass is the primary fishing activity in this section of the Columbia River.

Over the last eight years the Port's boating facility has benefitted from many Boating Facility Grant improvements. As a result, the facilities are becoming more popular with recreational boaters. The installation of the marine fuel station has increased use by cruising boaters enjoying the Columbia River. In the last couple of years, the Port has received requests for showers. The need for showers led to discussions about whether the existing restroom could be remodeled or if it were more efficient and cost effective to replace the restroom. The existing restroom is estimated to be approximately 50 years old based on style and architecture. It was determined that replacing the restroom with a new restroom/shower building was the most efficient and effective approach.

In discussions with the Port it was also noted that the parking spaces, travel lanes and turn radius did not meet current design standards and there was a limited amount of single car parking spaces by the Port office. The area did not have sidewalks or delineated pedestrian walking areas within the facility, but pedestrians were walking through to connect into the existing gravel walking trail. It was noted that parking improvements could be incorporated into the final phase of boating facility improvements.

The Port also noted that they were seeing an increase of use by nonmotorized boaters. The

Port had previously developed an access site directly on the Columbia River for windsurfers and kiteboarders. Some nonmotorized boaters were not comfortable launching directly into this section of the Columbia River because of significant wind generated waves. The Port identified an existing gravel area between the parking area and walking trail that could be easily enhanced to serve nonmotorized boaters who want to play in calmer water or have the opportunity to get their paddles in motion before encountering the main Columbia River.

APPROACH

The Port will follow their procurement practices to receive bids and select a contractor. The restroom will be ordered from state price agreement. The Port will monitor the project and consult with OSMB staff during the process.

EXPECTED RESULTS

The new restroom with showers will serve the cruising boaters, RV and marina users, wind surfer/kite boarders, walkers and boat ramp users. Updating the parking area to meet current design standards will improve boater experience. Separating nonmotorized boating use from the launch ramp and designating gravel single car parking will encourage use by kayakers and stand up paddleboarders.

OBJECTIVES

Replace restroom with restroom and shower building, renovate parking area, add sidewalks, enhance nonmotorized boating access and create single car parking to serve the access and walking trail users.

USEFUL LIFE

The boating improvements have an anticipated useful life of 20-30 years based on documented useful life of similar construction in Oregon.

FEES

Port of Arlington currently does not charge a use fee for the Port ramp. The owner does not anticipate modifications to the user fees. The Port does charge for power hook-up in the short term moorage, \$20 for under 20 ft., \$30 for over 30 ft. Port of Arlington currently receives \$6,100 in Maintenance Assistance Program (MAP) funding and \$900 in Clean Vessel Act (CVA) funds which they match with a minimum of \$4,366.67 in resources.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION

The proposed improvements will benefit many different park users such as motorized and nonmotorized boaters, RV campers, marina tenants, pedestrians, wind surfers and kite boarders. Because of the diversity of use OSMB staff have requested a prorated budget from the Port. The Port identified proration for the restroom and shower building but not for the other estimate line items. As a result, OSMB staff completed in the prorated estimate and submitted a copy to the Port asking them to review and provide comments back. The Port will be meeting with their consultant to review the information.

Staff identified estimated non-eligible amount of \$242,358.94. Staff believes the Port should increase their match by \$100,008.94 to address the non-recreational boating uses for the proposed improvements. The funds can be provided by other grant sources, donations or other match provided by the Port. Several of these items would make a strong Oregon State Parks grant application.

Staff recommends the Board challenge the Port to increase their match by \$100,008.94 for the non-recreational boating uses of the proposed improvements. Staff recommends the Board authorize Facility Grant 1640 in the amount of \$167,189.36 Boating Facility Grant funds and \$86,561.70 Waterway Access Grant funds to match \$251,893.26 of applicant match as identified in the modified budget. The total project cost is \$505,644.32. This grant recommendation is contingent upon the Port increasing matching funds within 60 days from the date of the Board meeting.

Item No. A - Boating Facility Grant Consideration

- O1. A total of 19 Facility Grant applications were received identifying \$2,188,366.53 in project needs and requesting \$1,496,338.20 from 2019-21 OSMB funding. One grant application was withdrawn No. 1658 ODFW, Twickenham property acquisition. In discussion with ODFW they decided to withdraw and may reapply at a future time if items can be resolved. Staff reviewed each application and provided funding recommendations for the Board to consider. The complete grant applications and attachments submitted by the applicants were provided electronically to the Board.
- O2. There were two new items to the grant evaluation process. The first was an opportunity for the public to provide comments on the applications. Comments were solicited through social media, website, direct email to interested parties, press release and ODFW shared the information as well. A total of fifty people submitted 67 comments on the grant applications received. An additional seven comments were received that identified needs at other locations which were shared with the facility owners, non-specific support for any nonmotorized access improvements, surprise with the lack of applications from Eastern Oregon and about the permit. Staff wants to acknowledge Ashley Massey for the work she did to set up the webpage, weekly prompts on social media and coordinating with ODFW to promote the opportunity in the Recreation Report and Daily Digest Bulletin. In addition, acknowledge Jennifer Peterson for creating fillable application forms, loading items onto the website, receiving and verifying applications were complete and reading, responding and organizing the comments as they arrived.

The second addition to the grant evaluation process was the incorporation of the Policy and Environment and Boating Safety Sections into the scoring process. This additional review added value to the process and provided an agency perspective. Staff anticipates making a couple modifications that will be shared with the Board at the October meeting in preparation to soliciting Cycle 1 grant applications for the 2021-23 biennium. Staff wants to acknowledge Brian Paulsen, MariAnn McKenzie and Josh Mulhollem for their time to review the applications in addition to the entire Facilities Program staff of Jeff Smith, Stuart Jantze, Joe Glossop, Allen Chiou, Doug Baer, Joe Severson and Jennifer Peterson.

O3. The agency budget proposes \$6,482,415 in state boater funds (OF) and \$1,743,912 in federal funds (FF) for Special payments during 2019-21 biennium. To determine the amount of funds available for the competitive grant program, special payments are reduced for Maintenance Assistance Program (MAP), Small Grants, previously awarded grants and subsequent grant awards as detailed in the following table.

- 04. Staff is recommending \$512,779.06 of Boating Facility Grant state funds, \$466,902.54 of Waterway Access Grant funds, \$50,400.00 federal funds and a cost increase of \$63,419.34 of Boating Facility Grant state funds. If the Board approves the requests as recommended a total of \$1,093,500.94 state and federal boating funds would be authorized to improve boating access and provide boating safety and education to underserved communities. Staff anticipates having funding available for Cycle 3 for advanced pre-purchase of materials such as docks, precast concrete planks, piling or other material.
- O5. Historically, the Board has considered grant applications in block votes based on size of the request, type of funding or staff recommendation. Applicants are not required to attend the Board meeting if their application is identified in one of the blocks votes. Applicants are encouraged to attend the meeting if their grant will be considered individually, in order to answer any questions the Board may have. Applicants who disagree with Staff recommendation may request to have their grant application considered individually by the Board at the meeting. Likewise, any Board member may ask to have an application removed from a block vote and be considered individually.
