<u>Correspondence</u> - There will work done on Church Inter county drain this spring. Deb Price from St John's and Kylee Mead from Dewitt are running for Clinton County Clerk, in 2020. The large recycling for the county held at the Road Commission will be April 25th, 2020. They are going to have a free tire collection due to a grant from the state.

OLD BUSINESS

<u>Tabled CAASA Budget</u> Was brought back for discussion with a motion by Kindel and seconded by Graham MP. The budget passed after discussion with a roll call vote of 5-0.

Contract Resolution was accepted \$3.00 per capita with another dedicated \$3.00 amount totaling \$6.00 for the new FY 2020-2021 without any monies affecting the residents of Greenbush Township. <u>Road Report -</u> Various projects will be done through the rest of remaining FY year. Colony Road will become a cul de sac in 2021 by the state. This will have Scott Rd paved from Colony to Kinley. If the

road millage passes the stretch from French to Colony will hopefully be paved. The state will be doing various project on US 27 in 2021. Hall Rd. from Krepps to Chandler road will be grated, ditches made and more gravel added by the CCRC.

NEW BUSINESS

<u>Budget</u> - discussion by the board on the changes to the 2020-2021. Budget Amendments for the 2019-2020 FY was approved by the board unanimously Money was moved from over funded line items to line items that were short. This is done to balance the year end budgets. No money is taken from the general fund.

<u>Road Millage</u>—As the Township goes forth with placing the proposed road millage on the August primary passes the added tax to our residents and it_will take place starting Dec. 2020 thru Dec.2023 We will have the proposal reviewed by Catherine at MTA to insure that the wording is correct.
