We decided to have 1st and 2nd place Jackpot using the largest fish caught since the only Calico was caught by Captain Steve Kelly!



Man what a killer fishery DVL has been!

I hit up the Jewell today with my son Little Big Ed and we were about 5th in line. It had occurred to me I had forgotten to purchase a 2010 fishing license so after a quick little stop at the tackle shop that slowed me down five valuable minutes we were off to our first stop only to find somebody camped out right on my favorite spot. That guy stayed there right on the spot for over three hours so there was no need for me to ask him later when I saw him how he did.

Well it caused me to go looking at spot number two that only produced one fish and one missed bite in ten casts or so. I only spent 10 minutes there at number two. The bite at DVL has been fast, hard and furious for the first 30-45 minutes of the morning before it slows down as the light gradually increases. I knew at this point I only had 15-20 minutes max before the bite would shutdown so I exploited a new area that I had been scoping out from a distance that had many of the same key features that spot number one has and it payed off handsomely. We landed a fish every other cast for the next 15 minutes in 20'-35' feet of water and just like a light switch it was over as soon as it started.



Today I did more knot tieing and more rig unsticking than I wanted. Little Ed got to fish unbothered and I got to hand him fresh gear and spend more time undoing tangles and being a guide and he still had the nerve to tell me he thought he had big fish for the day.

Today water temps were only one full degree colder than last week about 57.5 degrees. Today I could not get bit on the big 10" worm as I had the previous two weeks. They ate the carolina rigged brushogg with a passion as they were also doing earlier. After 8:00am rolled around we began to throw drop shots both shallow and deep for a couple of dinks and ended up with two more clone LMB to round out the day. Those fish both came out of 50'+ deep. We ended up with about 10 fish and were off the lake by noon thirty.

This lake is awesome. I think I will be hitting Perris for the next couple of weeks in hopes of finding a pattern for my upcoming club tournament Jan 23rd. Im banking on finding some willing fish that will chew now that DVL has opened to relive the pressure.
