

A Note from Pastor Toni

In this season of Lent I encourage you to deliberately choose to spend time daily with the Lord in His word. We are Jesus followers given the privilege of sharing the good news with those who are lost. Jesus came to earth on a rescue mission for the people He created; to bring them to Himself and provide an eternity with Him. We too are on a rescue mission; we are His ambassadors of that good news!

I so enjoyed the series called <u>BELLS!</u> It was a simple reminder of how we can reach out to those who do not yet know the saving grace of Jesus Christ in their lives. That series taught us to bless people, invite people to eat with us, listen to God, learn from His Word and be available to be Sent to whomever God puts in our path.

Maybe this Lenten season you can choose to improve on your "bell-ringing" and reach out to the people God places on your path each day. Walk in the awareness that you are a child of God and a person of worth and give that away to others! Be a forgiver. Be an encourager. Be an atmosphere changer! Be a listener. Be whatever it takes to share Jesus with someone. Your community, your family, your co-workers, your neighbors need you more than they know and maybe more than you know!

We serve a risen Lord! Our Creed states that:

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father; through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation he came down from

heaven, was incarnate of the Holy Spirit and the Virgin Mary and became truly human. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried.

I'm certainly relieved that the Creed doesn't end there! Up to this point it's just a remarkable story of creation and sacrifice, but that's it.

If Jesus had *just* suffered, and was *just* buried, there would be no hope. But the story does not end there, and neither does the Creed:

On the third day he rose again according to the Scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father.

He <u>rose again</u>! He ascended to heaven and todayright now as you read this – Jesus is sitting at the right hand of the Father. And we are His ambassadors of that Good News!!! That is everything! As the Apostle Paul wrote to the Corinthians:

"And if Christ has not been raised, our preaching is useless and so is your faith (1 Cor. 15:14).

We have the BEST news ever for a world that is suffering, struggling, hurting, shocked by heinous acts of indifference and evil, and constantly questioning why? What we experience in our lives and see in our world is not the end of the story. NO matter how down I get that is what keeps me going. No eye has seen, no ear has heard, no mind has imagined, what God has prepared for those who love Him! 1 Cor. 2:9

Let's be sure no one misses that good news. Let's be sure that everyone hears about the great love of a great God who never gives up on anyone!

Between now and Easter would you please take some time to be an Ambassador for Jesus. Invite someone to worship with you on Sundays. Spend time with them and let them see the light of Christ in you.




The Book Club

Wait Till Next Year is the story of a young girl growing up in the suburbs of New York in the 1950s, when owning a single-family home on a tree-lined street meant the realization of dreams, when everyone knew everyone else on the block, and the children gathered in the streets to play from sunup to sundown. The neighborhood was equally divided among Dodger, Giant and Yankee fans, and the corner stores were the scenes of fierce and affectionate rivalries.

As we go into this Passover season, let's go in with Praise & Worship with what God has done and with great expectations of what He is going to do!!


