Bits & Pieces

Devotion: The Messiness of New Beginnings ~ by Inez Hollmann

Like all of you, I go to an imperfect church. I have failed it in innumerable ways, and I've felt the sting of disappointment there, too. But every Sunday that I go, I find Jesus there. I am renewed in tiny or even enormous ways. But mostly, when I look around the room, I see the faces of people that are good, courageous, committed and loving and I cannot imagine doing life without them. They are quite simply the best people I know. The struggles and addictions and losses they have overcome would flatten you it's just a "little church on the prairie," but it is full of bravery. And they love well. They love each other, they love the staff, they love the community, and they love God. That's enough.

I recently saw this anonymous quote: "No one can go back and start a new beginning, but anyone can start today and make a new ending." I really began to think about that statement. The conclusion was that we don't start over; we begin again right where we are, making things better in our lives.

Now is the time of New Beginnings, not only for Bethany Lutheran Church, but for every day. As a believer in Christ, it is not about saying I will do this and I won't do that and then dropping the idea or falling short. It is more about asking the Lord to help us each day, to live a more pious life, and to fall deeper and deeper in love with Him. This way our focus will be set on the things of heaven and not on all this earthly stuff.

When I say pious or living a life of piety, what comes to your mind? Is it negative? Do you envision someone standing on the street corner thumping their Bible and telling others that they are missing out if they don't know Christ? Or doing things for the church to get noticed and receive praise and adulation? That's not what being pious is about. It is about *building an intimate relationship with Christ*.

If I were to make a resolution, it would be to have a deeper commitment, a deeper love, and a deeper worship for the Lord. Several months ago, He spoke to me in that still small voice in prayer and said, "I am more than enough. I am more than enough in every area of your life." He also said to tell others the same thing. I am determined to make Him my all in all. Jesus wants our undivided attention in spite of the distractions and temptations that are waiting around the corner. He has to be our main focus.

How we will end this year will be determined by how we started it. Did we want to get more intimate with Jesus, the lover of our soul? I looked up the word intimacy and the meaning is to be "close, familiar, very personal and private." Your life can be filled with hope and peace. Why should every year be the same as the one before with nothing really changing?

Now is the time of New Beginnings, a new pastor, a fresh look at how you define church. Now is the time to rekindle the love affair with your Lord. He calls us to Himself and says, "Come away, my heart." The real ending in our life will be when Jesus says "Well done, my good and faithful servant." That statement will be for someone who took the time to get to know Him, love Him, and obediently follow Him.

My prayer for you today is that you find church where Jesus is lifted high and people are loved, and plant there with all your might. Our church will be imperfect. The pastor and leaders will not magically make life fulfilling. People will let you down (and you them). Stuff will go sideways and have to be righted. There will be hard conversations and honest confessions, apologies and lots of forgiveness. But the presence of these things doesn't mean you are doing it wrong; it means you are renewing and building a church with human people and you love them too much to let it all slip through your fingers without fighting for unity.

May we find grace for our church today. May we find our tribe and love them hard. I hope that today, or maybe someday, you'll look around the sanctuary like I do and marvel at what beautiful, wonderful people you are surrounded by, grateful that you get to love God and love each other and love people together, imperfectly.
