The King James Bible—A Blood-Bought Book

From 1,000 Years of Martyrdoms to America and Evangelizing the World

While I was in-transit today I presented a man with the gospel and he became very angry with me. He insisted on the matter of the Kingdom of God, that we do not need to be saved, that Jesus is not God and that we are not supposed to go to Heaven, but that seemed like a Jehovah's False Witness argument to me. He proceeded to get on my bus and carry on loudly on the bus using his NIV. After some time I told him plainly, "We read two different Bibles. I can't agree with you."



Many Christian families in the Dark Ages were thrown to the lions because they would not recant Jesus Christ or the beliefs of the Anabaptist church. They only had portions of the Bible and valued them, unlike today where we can purchase over 100 different versions of the Bible.

For the word of God is quick, and powerful, and sharper than any twoedged sword, piercing even to the dividing asunder of soul and spirit, and of the joints and marrow, and is a discerner of the thoughts and intents of the heart (Hebrews 4:12).

The Bible has many things to say about itself, especially in Psalm 119, the entire Psalm of which mentions the world of God in every verse. And in every case, the Bible glorifies the Word of God as it represents Jesus Christ who is called **the Word**: *And he was clothed with a vesture dipped in blood: and his name is called The Word of God (Revelation 19:13).* That is because the Bible is about Jesus' sacrifice on the cross without which we could not be saved. It is from the fourth chapter of Genesis when Abel brought his lamb for a sacrifice: *And Abel, he also brought of the firstlings of his flock and of the fat thereof;* to the gospels where Jesus did the will of God by going to the cross: *O my Father, if it be possible, let this cup pass from me: nevertheless not as I will, but as thou wilt.* And with the cross comes the blood Jesus shed.

It is not just the people in the Bible that make it what it is, it is people throughout history that stood by the Bible. During the Dark Ages (500 AD-1500 AD) most people did not have a Bible and it could only be read by a pastor who got ahold of portions of it. But the martyrs of the dark Ages were the greatest Christians who ever lived. People did not really have a complete Bible back then, they savored what little they had. Today we can buy a complete Bible for about \$5 but people have no concern for it

and often times hate the Bible. If people are not hating the Bible they are wresting it to appeal to their sin (such as a homosexual born-again church which is blasphemy of the Holy Spirit).



The blood Jesus shed on the cross sealed us until redemption, and it is the driving element behind the Bible.

But people need not defend the Bible—it is God's word it will defend itself. It is the rebellion against the Bible that causes nations to fall, and America is no exception. King James had it translated from the original Textus Receptus into the common King James Version that was used

in the foundation of our country as a way for Europeans, especially the Christian Martyrs, to escape persecution. That is why most common people came to America during its formative years. And do not let historians tell you otherwise. It has been so long since people were burned at the stake for denying the heresies of the Catholic church that we've forgotten the blood that is behind this country.

The freedom of religion, our First Amendment, is made possible by the Second Amendment—the right to bear arms. And all along there have been Baptists who follow the KJV and have been soul winning and obeying God's commandments and as such they have maintained God's blessing on this country. But as you see by my introduction, many people have followed the hundred other perversions of the Bible (including the bus rider's NIV) and can not please God that way.

We can only hope that the people who bless the KJV and are ardent soul winners and live by the traditions of the Baptist will continue to live in this country.
