My visit with Barbara Greenwood

During the last year on numerous occasions poems by Walter Greenwood have appeared in our morning bulletin and Hi-Lites. I thought members of Zion might enjoy learning about the author of "That Ye Might Believe. "In an effort to familiarize myself about Walter I made a visit to Walter's wife since Walter is not in good health as the present time.

Walter was born in 1935 in Newark, New Jersey. He grew up in Bloomfield, New Jersey where he attended the local public schools. Following graduation, he attended the Newark College of Engineering where he received a B.S. degree in electrical engineering.

He then joined the Air Force which offered him the opportunity to attend the Air Force Institute of Technology where he earned an M.S. degree in astronautics. This was his focus during his 20 years in the Air Force. He served time in Alaska, Ohio, California, Maryland, DC and Massachusetts.

Following his time in the Air Force he worked in the private sector as an aeronautical engineer.

During his lifetime Walter enjoyed writing poems about holidays. Having been a church member from his youth he was an avid Bible reader. When he read a passage from the Bible, he would write a poem relating to his reading. He read and wrote about Christ's life which became the book, "That Ye Might Believe." The book was published in 2007. When it first became available the

the cost was \$25. Then Walter decided the book should not be sold but donated to anyone wishing for a copy. There have been 5000 copies printed one of which is in our Zion collection. There are copies which have been sent to many countries throughout the world. This was Walter's wish.

I had the pleasure of meeting and visiting Walter and his wife several years ago. They at the time were living in a cottage at Penn Hall. My reason for visiting was to see Walter's model train display which covered one bedroom.

It showed a person with the electrical background needed to design and build such a beautiful roomful of trains, mountains and villages. When I was leaving Walter's wife offered me 10 copies of the book which I shared with members of Zion as well as friends. Despite his present condition he still communicates, remains the cheerful, pleasant gentleman who is still able to sing in his beautiful voice at the Sunday Chapel services.

It was my great pleasure to meet this very talented man and feel so privileged to be given a copy of his book. Pat Hileman
