



## Parish Pastoral Council Membership



With the customary rotation at hand of some members going off of our parish's Pastoral Council (PC) and in preparation for our annual nomination and election process of new members, it is timely to review requirements for membership on it. The idea is to encourage beforehand qualified and eligible parishioners to prayerfully consider serving on our PC.

**What is the Pastoral Council?** Briefly, per Church Law, the Parish Pastoral Council is a structure of consultation to the pastor. It is a planning council, not a coordinating council; a consultative group pursuing the mission of the parish church with the pastor. The consultation of the Pastoral Council is essential in the decision-making process, but the Pastoral Council is not the decision maker. (Canon 536).

## Who sits on the PC? When does it meet?

Our parish's Pastoral Council meets almost monthly and consists of elected and appointed members. Persons deemed eligible to serve on our parish's Pastoral Council must meet such requirements as the following:

- \*Be in full communion with the Catholic Church and a registered parishioner of St. Mary for a year as of the upcoming election date;
- \*Able to attend the Vigil or Sunday Mass most weekends of the month throughout the year (save vacations, holiday visiting, and such like). Not so regularly attending, for whatever reason, renders one out of touch with a pivotal part of the parish and thus severely limited in the advisory PC role;
- \*Subscribe to the "Spirituality of Stewardship" involving the sharing of their time, talent, and treasure to their parish and Diocesan Church;
- \* Able to attend the meetings and willing to accept some tasks as part of committee business;
- \*Be interested in the overall spiritual and temporal welfare of the parish and be without an inordinate attachment to a group or personal agenda.
- \*Endorse the mission statement of the parish;
- \*Be 18 years of age and conversant in English;

## Month of May is Mary's Month



Traditionally Catholics pray the rosary more often during the month of May and so are reminded to do as we start May this week. "Throughout the centuries, the Church has turned to the Blessed Virgin in order to come closer to Christ. Many forms of piety toward the Mother of God developed that help bring us closer to her Son.
