Jacob Graf, 81, of 236 N. Risky Road, Bay Port, passed away Tuesday, Nov. 25 at Huron Medical Care Facility, near Bad Axe, following a six-month illness.

Mr. Graf was born in Germany on Oct. 22, 1905, son of John and Catherine (Schmidt) Graf. They moved to Ohio when he was a child, and moved to Bay Port, where he lived for the past 65 years. He was a shovel operator at Wallace Stone Company for 45 years, retiring in 1969.

Mr. Graf was married to Betty Mae Omich in Ohio on April 28, 1946, and she preceded him in death on December 2, 1976. He served in the U.S. Army during World War II, and was a member of Steele - Lambert American Legion Post 533 of Bay Port.
