Trees to be exhibited shall be within the 5 to 7 feet height range measuring from the bottom of the handle to the top of the tip.

No trees may be exhibited that have been sprayed with or have artificial color or other chemicals added in any manner.

No trees may be exhibited with limbs or foliage added that did not grow naturally in place.

Trees may be naturally grown or sheared and shaped by the exhibitor.

Entries must have a tag attached showing name and address of the exhibitor and class number in which the trees are to be exhibited. Only one (1) tree may be entered in each class by an exhibitor.

No holders should accompany trees. All trees will be supported in like manner.

Trees exhibited remain the property of the exhibitor and may be claimed after 9:00 p.m. on Saturday, after that time they become property of the fair.
