Together we will explore how we are called to live out the Heart of God in community and for community.

"You know, you could do a series about friendship and use that and so many other great songs." How could I resist? There are so many wonderful stories on this theme it was hard to narrow it down but together we will explore stories of the friendships of King David and Jonathan. Moses and Aaron, Levitical instructions about caring for neighbors. Jesus and the disciples, Paul and his friends in Ephesus, and the stories of how friendships build community that strengthens mission. All of this AND we'll have great music throughout the series. Since God finds surprising ways and surprising people to make Godself known to us, we thought it would be fun to use a few surprising songs to mix into our hymn selections throughout this series. We hope you will find yourself smiling as you sing along! Also, spoiler alert: there will be a dance party during worship on the final day of this series on September 7. Remember to wear your boogie shoes that Sunday!

Hello Hope UCC!!!

What an inspiring and enriching experience it was to attend "Into the Deep" at General Synod 35 in Kansas City, MO! I cherished the opportunity to connect with individuals from across our nation, from engaging in plenary sessions to sharing meals with new friends.

A particular highlight was meeting Rev. Shari Prestemon, our newly elected Associate General Minister & Co-Executive of Global Ministries. Her extensive resume, is as long as the state of Illinois, is matched only by her profound servant heart, and I was deeply impressed by her ability to empower us all. I also had the distinct pleasure of meeting Rev. Dr. Karen Georgia Thompson, the General Minister and President and Chief Executive Officer of the United Church of Christ. As the first woman and the first woman of African descent to lead the denomination, Rev. Thompson exemplifies humble leadership and a beautiful spiritual soul. I eagerly anticipate further opportunities to connect with these two remarkable women.

The Illinois Conference proudly contributed 55 of the approximately 650 delegates. We participated in votes on 11 resolutions, with all but one passing. You can view all resolutions <u>HERE</u>. Two resolutions generated significant debate:

Proposed Revision to the UCC Constitution and Bylaws: This resolution, which would have changed the election of Associate General Ministers to an appointment by the General Minister and President, did not pass, falling short of the required two-thirds vote. The language "appointed" proved contentious for many delegates. I spoke against it, advocating for a "Call Committee" and synod vote process. I encourage you to read the full story and the proposed resolution HERE and share your thoughts.

STAR (Small Town And Rural Churches) Resolution: General Synod adopted a resolution recognizing the Small Town and Rural (STAR) Coalition of the United Church of Christ as a Self-Created Group. This resolution also prompted extensive debate. Some delegates voiced concerns about a potential "hidden agenda" to shift the denomination towards a more moderate stance, away from its progressive leanings. What are your reflections on this? This trip was truly wonderful, and I am deeply grateful to Hope UCC in supporting my faith journey toward ordination.


All Church Service Trip to Feed My Starving Children: Saturday September 20!
