Reflecting on the Things of the Past By C.S.

It's hard to make any sense of the world today. You would think with all of the people dying around the world, people would start to take some of these things serious. But instead, most people are complaining and have turned instead to their crooked ways and gave cause to the adversity to disrespect one another. You'd better believe that God sees every-thing that is happening to us, past, present, and future. He knows all, nothing surprises Him, and nothing sneaks by Him unnoticed. He promises that all things work together for the good of those who love Him. This is still true whether or not we understand why things happen the way they do. No matter how dark or despairing things may seem at the moment, God is in full control.

Let me ask you all this, what would happen if you approached a fork in the road and found two signs, one reading "Road to comfort" and the other, "Road to adversity"? Would you agree that most of us would probably veer onto the path of comfort with a sigh of relief, because no one wants to experience pain, disappointment, or loss. Yet through my years of imprisonment, I've learned that hardships are essential and part of the believer's spiritual journey.

First of all, adversity reveals our view of the Lord. The more clearly, we understand who God is and what He desires to accomplish in us, the stronger our faith will be and the greater our joy. It's when we stay focused on the negative aspects of our current circumstances, that we may begin to doubt His loving sovereignty and good purpose.

Secondly, I've learned that adversity teaches us the truth about ourselves. Sinful attitudes and misplaced priorities often come to the surface in times of affliction. Though we may just want the situation to improve, God intends to teach us through it. So, it's important that we have a willingness to learn. Instead of seeing our difficulties as loss, we need to view them as a means God uses to build our endurance. Then we may be, as James says, in *James 1:4*, *"Let perseverance finish its work so that you may be mature and complete, not lacking anything."*

God's Word tells us, in *Numbers 32:23, "But if you fail to do this, you will be sinning against the Lord; and you may be sure that your sin will find you out."* And I for one know all too well, that the secret sin will lead to public consequences. It may appear for a season that a person is getting away with a certain sin. Their life may seem to be as good as anyone else's, but in the end, there will always be evidence of the choices they have made. Sin is a powerful foe. In this place, I would say a plain word or two to those who understand the method of justification by faith, which is in Christ Jesus, but whose trouble is that they cannot cease from sinning. We can never be happy, restful, or spiritually healthy until we become holy. We must be rid of sin, but how is the riddance to be shaped? This is the life-or-death question of many. The old nature is very strong, and I have tried to curb and even tame it, but it will not be subdued. Then I would find myself, though anxious to be better, stubborn. The passions are so furious, the thoughts are so changeable, the imagination is so ungovernable. The desires are so wild, that the man feels that he has a den of wild beasts within himself, which will eat him up sooner than be ruled by him.

We may say of our fallen nature what the Lord said to Job concerning Leviathan, in Job 41:5, "Wilt thou play with him as with a bird? or wilt thou bind him for thy maidens?" A man might as well hope to hold the North wind in the hollow of his hand as to expect to control by his own strength, those discipline powers which fall within his fallen nature. So it is with an ungodly man, you cannot force him to do what a renewed man does most willingly. Yes, you may teach him, and set a good example, but he cannot learn the art of holiness, for he has no mind to it. His nature leads him another way. When the Lord makes a new man of him, then all things wear a different aspect. So great is this change, that the new nature follows after right as naturally as the old nature wandered after the wrong.

What a blessing to receive such a nature that only the Holy Spirit can give. I'm sure you would agree that man is more than a body made of flesh and bones. He is a spirit, and he has a soul which consists of a mind, a will, and emotions. It is the personality of man. Sinners suffer in their mind. They are filled with mental anguish and no matter what they do or possess there is nothing that completely satisfies them. They suffer emotionally. Since they have chosen to run their own lives, they become frustrated and angry, emotionally upset, when things don't go their way. They know nothing of faith. Trusting God, a power greater than themselves is incomprehensible to them. They never enter rest in their souls because one may only enter the rest of God. As *Hebrews 4:3* tells us, *"For we which have believed do enter into rest, as He said, 'As I have sworn in My wrath, if they shall enter into My rest,' although the works were finished from the foundation of the world."*

Sadly, this world is not a friend to grace. This my brothers and sisters is what God says about the outcome of a person who attempts to live without Him, who miss merciful, longsuffering, and slow to anger. Even though in my own past life, I too have gone far into sin and living openly in rebellion. I have done evil with both hands, going from bad to worse while persisting in ungodliness. I now realize that my friends and family must have looked upon me with disgust, rather than with hope. But not so of my God!

No one else would ever have thought of justifying those who are guilty. He, in the splendor of His grace having chosen some of them before the foundation of the world, will not rest until He has justified them, and made them to be accepted in the beloved. Is this not written in *Romans 8:30, "Moreover whom He did predestinate, them He also called: and whom He called, them He also justified: and whom He justified, them He also glorified."* Thus, we see that there are some whom the Lord resolves to justify, why then should 'we' not be in those numbers!? No one but God would ever have thought of justifying me. I am a wonder to myself, and I doubt not that is equally seen in others.

Look at Saul of Tarsus, who foamed at the mouth against God's servants, "As for Saul, he made havock of the church, entering into every house, and haling men and women committed them to prison." (Acts 8:3) Like a hungry wolf, he worried the lambs and sheep right and left, and yet listen to Scripture as God struck him down on the road to Damascus, "As he neared Damascus on his journey, suddenly a light from heaven flashed around him. He fell to the ground and heard a voice say to him, "Saul, Saul, why do you parsoante Map" "Who are you, Lord?' Saul asked. "I am Jasus, when you are parsoanting," he replied. "New get up and go into the align, and you will be talk what you must do, "" (Acts 9:3-6) It was right there, on his way to persecute more of God's people that Jesus was able to change his heart, and so fully justified him that before long, this very man became the greatest preacher of justification by faith that ever has lived.

Saul/Paul must have often marveled that even he was justified, by faith in Jesus Christ, for he once was a persecutor for salvation by the works of the law. None but God would have ever thought of justifying such a man as Saul. So, I say to you all, how much more can He do, the same for sinners like us.

Oh, how the Lord is glorious in His grace. I can and will say, that the Lord has altogether delivered me from the power of my former habits and has made me an example of virtue. God cannot lie and in *Ezekiel 36:26* says this, *"I will give you a new heart and put a new spirit in you; I will remove from you your heart of stone and give you a heart of flesh."* Has it ever struck you what a wonderful thing it is for the Lord to give not only a new heart, but also a right spirit to those who seek Him? Perhaps some of you may have seen a lobster that has fought with another lobster and lost a claw, and a new claw has grown back? Wouldn't you say that this is a remarkable thing? But it is a much greater astounding fact that a man should have a new heart given to him. This indeed is a miracle beyond the powers of nature. Let's look at a tree for a minute. If you cut off one of its limbs, eventually another one will grow in its place, but can 'we' change the tree? Can 'we' sweeten sour sap? Can 'we' make the thorns bear figs? We may be able to graft something better into it and that is the analogy which nature gives us of the work of grace, but absolutely to change the vital sap of a tree would be a miracle indeed.

There is such a marvelous mystery of power that God works in all who believe in His Son Jesus. If we yield ourselves up to His divine working, the Lord will alter our nature, He will subdue the old nature, and breathe new life into all who believe in Him! Let me encourage you all to put your trust in the Lord Jesus Christ. Where everything was once hard, everything shall become more tender. Where everything was vicious, everything will become virtuous. Where everything trended downward, everything shall rise upward with a divine driving force. The lion of anger shall give place to the Lamb of meekness, the raven of uncleanness shall fly before the dove of purity.

In my 11 years of incarceration, I have seen with my own eyes marvelous changes of moral and spiritual character. Blaspheming men who now delight in and around the Gospel. Thieves are made honest, and drunkards and druggies are sober. While liars become truthful, and scoffers become zealous. Wherever the grace of God has appeared to a man or woman it has trained them to deny ungodliness and worldly lusts. This same grace teaches us to live soberly, righteously, and godly even in this present evil world. Many people may not believe this fact, but it's only because they do not understand the grace and power of God, until they need it for themselves.

Even though we may be living in some troubling times, the life of faith is frequently contrary to typical human living. Jehoshaphat faced his difficulty by applauding God's past work and faithfulness, and by recalling God's promises. When we respond in a similar way, we too will be able to proceed with courage. The natural man (human) response to troubled times is self-pity. And to go over and over the details and repercussions of our problem only makes it seem more threatening. Instead, praise focusses our attention on God, and if we are looking to Him for our aid, then we can't help but to recognize His sovereignty.

Every trial that enters our life comes through His permissive will, which means that He has complete control. Whatever His reasons for allowing these things into our lives, He is faithful to see us through it all. In 2 Chronicles 20:9 we read, "If calamity comes upon us, whether the sword of judgment, or plague or famine, we will stand in Your presence before this temple that bears Your Name and will cry out to You in our distress, and You will hear us and save us."

The Value of Trials By M.D.

"Consider it all joy, my brothers, whenever you fall into various trials, knowing that the proving of your faith works endurance. And let endurance have its perfect work in order that you may be perfect and enhanced, wanting in nothing." (James 1:2-4)

These words of the Spirit, through James, just about say it all concerning the value of trials and temptations. They are blessings to the children of God. They may not seem so when we are hurting, but we who be **Overcomers for Christ** spirit builders, would do well to adopt the same philosophy of 'body builders' and their adage, "No pain, no gain". Indeed, on the one hand, "All disciples seem not joyful at present, but sorrowful; later, on the other hand, it gives back the peaceable fruit of righteousness to the ones who have been developed through it." (Hebrews 12:11) Therefor we are reminded, in 1 Peter 1:6-7, "In all this you greatly rejoice, though now for a little while you may have had to suffer grief in all kinds of trials. These have come so that the proven genuineness of your faith—of greater worth than gold, which perishes even though refined by fire—may result in praise, glory and honor when Jesus Christ is revealed."

It is human when suffering to grieve, even to be inclined to despondency, by the pain or trial or temptation or persecution. Yet we may find courage, not only in the knowledge that these things like bodily exercise, "We know that the law is good if one uses it properly," (1 Timothy 1:8) are given to us to strengthen us, but also in the knowledge that when we, "Resist him, standing firm in the faith, because you know that the family of believers throughout the world is undergoing the same kind of sufferings." (1 Peter 5:9) Believe this, satan is cosmopolitan, he shares his misery with everyone.

As those who trust in the Lord Jesus, we must remind ourselves what James 1:12 tells us, "Blessed is the one who perseveres under trial because, having stood the test, that person will receive the crown of life that the Lord has promised to those who love Him." Furthermore, 1 Corinthians 10:13 assures us, "No temptation has overtaken you except what is common to mankind. And God is faithful; He will not let you be tempted beyond what you can bear. But when you are tempted, He will also provide a way out so that you can endure it." Because of these things, the saint may face trials and temptations with confidence, crying in joy with these words from Paul, "Who shall separate us from the love of Christ? Shall trouble or hardship or persecution or famine or nakedness or danger or sword? As it is written: 'For your sake we face death all day long; we are considered as sheep to be slaughtered.' No, in all these things we are more than conquerors through Him who loved us. For I am convinced that neither death nor life, neither angels nor demons, neither the present nor the future, nor any powers, neither height nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God that is in Christ Jesus our Lord." (Romans 8:35-39)

I'll finish with this, "Do not waste time arguing over godless ideas and old wives' tales. Instead, train yourself to be godly. Physical training is good, but training for godliness is much better, promising benefits in this life and in the life to come." (1 Timothy 4:7-8 NLT)

Foot's Bible Study

Ezekiel 27:1-28:26

The beauty of Tyre was the source of its pride, and Tyre's pride guaranteed its judgment. Conceit or pride in our own accomplishments should be a danger signal to us. In James 4:13-17, "Look here, you who say, 'Today or tomorrow we are going to a certain town and will stay there a year. We will do business there and make a profit.' How do you know what your life will be like tomorrow? Your life is like the morning fog—it's here a little while, then it's gone. What you ought to say is, 'If the Lord wants us to, we will live and do this or that.' Otherwise you are boasting about your own pretentious plans, and all such boasting is evil. Remember, it is sin to know what you ought to do and then not do it."

God is not against our taking pleasure or finding satisfaction in what we do; He is against arrogance and inflated selfesteem that looks down on others. We must acknowledge God as the basis and source of our life.. (27:3-4

As truly wise people get closer to God, they recognize their need to depend on Him for guidance. (28:2-3)

Hebrews 11:17-31

Abraham was willing to give up His own son when God commanded him to do so. See Genesis 22:1-19. God did not let Abraham take Isaac's life, because God has given the command in order to test Abraham's faith. Instead of taking Abraham's son, God gave Abraham a whole nation of descendants through Isaac. If you are afraid to trust God with the possession, dream, or person you treasure most, pay attention to Abraham's example. Because Abraham was willing to give up everything for God, he received back more than he could have imagined. What we receive, however, is not always immediate or in the form of material possessions. Material things should be among the least satisfying of rewards. Our best and greatest rewards await us in eternity. (11:17-19)

Psalms 111:1-10

The only way to become wise is to fear (revere) God. This same thought is expressed in Proverbs 1:7-9, "Fear of the Lord is the foundation of true knowledge, but fools despise wisdom and discipline. A Father's Exhortation: Acquire Wisdom My child, listen when your father corrects you. Don't neglect your mother's instruction. What you learn from them will crown you with grace and be a chain of honor around your neck."

Too often people want to skip this step, thinking they can become wise by life experience and academic knowledge alone. But if we do not acknowledge God as the source of wisdom, then our foundation for making wise decisions is shaky, and we are prone to mistakes and foolish choices. (111:10)

Proverbs 27:15-16

Quarrelsome nagging, a steady stream of unwanted advice is a form of torture. People nag because they think they're not getting through, but nagging hinders communication more than it helps. When tempted to engage in this destructive habit, stop and examine your motives. Are you more concerned about yourself - getting your way, being right – than about the person you are pretending to help? If you are truly concerned about other people, think of a more effective way to get through to them. Surprise them with words of patience and love and see what happens. (27:15-16)

Blessings to you all, I would like you all to remember that no matter what is happening, even in the worst of circumstances, it is you who decides what becomes of you mentally and spiritually. "Do not merely listen to the Word, and so deceive yourselves. Do what it says." - James 1:22

We've been looking at *Mark 12:30, "You must love the Lard your God with all your beart, all your soul, all your mind, and all your strength,"* One way to restate this verse is love God with all your talk, all your feelings, all your thinking, and all your doing.

Although every person is called to do all of these things, God created each person to be stronger in one area. That means God has shaped you more naturally to be a talker (heart), feeler (soul), thinker (mind), or doer (strength).

Let's look at the thinkers, who most readily love God with their minds. Do you know that you can love God with your intellect? When you develop and strengthen your mind, it's an act of worship.

One way you can recognize a thinker is by this: When thinkers become believers, they fall in love with the Bible.

Psalm 119:97 says, "How I love your law! I think about it all day long." (GNT)

There is no other book in the world like the Bible! It has the answers to life's questions, including why God put you here on earth.

We need thinkers—because the world needs consideration. Somebody has to be thinking through complex issues and the implications of what the rest of us are doing. We need people who think through tough problems and bring solutions to the table.

But thinkers need to be careful to also practice humility. The Bible says, "Don't be impressed with your own wisdom" (Proverbs 3:7 NLT). Why? Because God is God, and you're not.

Humility is a choice. James 4:10 says, "Humble yourselves before the Lord" (NIV). Humility is something you do to yourself. And it's not denying your strengths; it's being honest about your weaknesses.

Thinkers also need to be careful to practice what they know. If you know it, then do it! James 1:22 says, "Do not merely listen to the word, and so deceive yourselves. Do what it says" (NIV).

Your personality is unique and precious to God. When you use it to serve Him with all your heart, soul, mind, and strength, you bring Him glory!
